Tuberculosis Topic For Program

A program on tuberculosis will be given Tuesday, November 18, at 7:45 p.m. at the Jackson county courthouse auditorium. The program is sponsored by the public health nurses of District 4, Oregon Nurses' association, and is for all registered and practical nurses of the area.

Included on the program will be several speakers and a panel which will present a hypothetical case on what happens to the tuberculosis patient as an individual. The panel will attempt to show the kind of human problems which tend to come between the tubercular patient and his needed hospitalization and the role of community agencies in helping him. Panel members will include Mrs. Hale Pragoff, medical social work consultant, state board of health, Portland, Miss Alena Makinen, public health nurse, and Miss Celia Walker, child welfare worker. Mrs. C. Ivan Burton will be moderator and represent the patient.

Dr. A. Erin Merkel, public health officer, will tell of the scope of the tuberculosis problem in the area and Dr. Ambrose S. Churchill, director of the tuberculosis control section, state board of health, Portland, will speak on "Tuberculosis Today and Tomorrow."

Mrs. Helen Tweedy will speak on case finding. It will deal with the x-ray program of the Jackson County Tuberculosis and Health association of which she is executive secretary.
