

Big Tackle Bulwarks Flier Line

A 268-pounder, who is the fastest lineman on the squad, will be seen in action Tuesday when a service-man's football team engages Southern Oregon college at the Medford stadium.

The player is Paul Daugherty. He is a tackle for the Moffett Naval Air Station and is a bulwark in a quick hard-charging line which has been a big factor in taking the Fliers to a 6-1 record this fall.

Daugherty at 6-6 is the biggest among the big on the Moffett team. Other heavies of the starting line are Dick Lowry, 210-pound guard, and James Jones, 194, tackle.

The Fliers will be minus the services of their regular fullback, Dick Snyder, but will have their dippy-do half-back sensation, Calvin Campbell, and crafty quarterback Dick Olivias.

Hurt in Mishap
Snyder, one of the main guns when Moffett trimmed the Raiders 40 to 25 at the start of the fall campaign, was hurt when his jet plane caught fire recently. He injured a leg going through the canopy when ejected from his plane. Snyder is a 215-pounder who played three years at the U. S. Naval Academy.

Campbell is the most talked about player on the Flier squad. He's received pro contract offers from the Green Bay Packers and Vancouver Lions. Six other National Football League clubs are looking his way. The dusky halfback is 170 pounds of greased lightning.

Olivias, short and chunky, is an able field general who passes well. He played a year at Pasadena Junior college and last year was all-12th Naval district.

The Fliers' only loss has been to San Quentin prison, 34 to 28. They come for the holiday game after playing Oregon Tech at Klamath Falls last night.

Red Raiders Subdue Eastern Oregonians

Ashland - Southern Oregon college put its 1958 Oregon Collegiate conference football season in the history book here Saturday afternoon, turning back Eastern Oregon 19 to 12 in a homecoming skirmish. They finished with a 2-2 record in the circuit.

The Red Raiders are not through for the fall, however. They play their second game in four days Tuesday meeting Moffett Naval Air Station in a Veteran's Day tussle at Medford. Game time will be 2 p.m.

Eastern got the jump in yesterday's encounter with a first panel marker. The Mountaineers blocked a Tony Brauner unt on the eight yard line. George Aliverti swept over from the one. SOC tied it in the second quarter. Lance Locke rolled for six yards with 46 seconds left in the half.

Brood Scores
The Raiders nabbed advantage of Neil Green's fumble recovery on the EOC 36 and Brood went across the pay line from the one. But the fracas was squared again on a John Houk pass to Aliverti for 36 yards.

Southern Oregon then broke

the deadlock with the two-yard off tackle run by Eldon Francis. Locke ran the extra point.

The raiders led in first downs 12 to 7 and in net yards gained 170 to 143. Brood had 56 and 45 punt runbacks for the SOC grid crew.

The setback completed the EOC conference schedule without a league triumph in two years.

Hornets Tip McLoughlin In Finale

Hedrick Junior High yielded the margin in yardage and took the edge in touchdowns Friday afternoon to trim McLoughlin 13 to 6 in a ninth grade grid battle at the senior high field.

It was the first Hornet ninth grade football decision over McLoughlin in four years of rivalry and wound up the season for both schools.

Breaks were utilized for all the scores. McLoughlin crossed the goal in the early minutes of the game, recovering a Mike McCullough fumble on the opening kick-off. Five plays moved the pigskin to the 16-yard line and George Clearwater circled right end to score.

Hedrick tied up the mix in the second quarter when John Fisher scooped the ball on a Mac backfield miff and toted it to the Bulldog 18-yard line. McCullough circled the right flank to go the rest of the way.

Pass Intercepted
Dave Irving intercepted a Craig Laurence of McLoughlin pass in the third quarter, giving the Hornets possession on their own 43. One play lost a yard but on the next, McCullough busted through right tackle and outran the opposition for a 59-yard journey to the goal. Irving passed to Norman Olson for the conversion.

McLoughlin drove deep into Hedrick territory on four occasions after its score and more than doubled the Hornets inn net yardage but was the victim of the East Side team's clutch tackling and its own lack of scoring punch. Bulldog surges went to the 10 yard line and to the eight in the second quarter and to the 15-yard mark and the one-foot line in the fourth period.

A motion penalty hurt the Bulldogs on final drive after a pass had given them first down on the Hedrick one. The infraction put them back to the six. Four plays later Hedrick had the ball and ran one down before the final signal.

McLoughlin had 283 net yards rushing and passing to Hedricks 138 and the fourth down margin was 14 to four.

Late WSC Touchdown Earns 7-0 Victory Over OSC

Pullman, Wash. - (UP) - Sophomore halfback Ted Cano sparked Washington State college to a late touchdown and a 7-0 victory over Oregon State Saturday and moved the Cougars into top contention for a bid to the Rose Bowl.

The inspired Cougars, thwarted twice by interceptions which halted deep marches, finally went all the way with three minutes left to play and knocked the Beavers out of first place in the Pacific Coast conference.

Washington State played inspired ball despite the slippery field that held the vaunted Oregon State single wing attack in check with only one exception, but could not muster a payoff drive itself, although WSC controlled the ball for much of the game period.

But they cashed in when an Oregon State quick kick wobbled off the foot of halfback Dainard Paulson and skidded out of bounds on the OSC 43 in the fourth period. It took ten plays to score the only touchdown.

It was Cano who legged it around left end 11 yards for a first down on the Oregon State 14 after it appeared the drive might bog down. Another big break for the Cougars put the ball on the one because of a penalty for roughness. Then Cano plunged over and the 17,500 homecoming fans howled with delight.

Halfback Lee Schoeder boot-ed the extra point after a clipping penalty moved the ball back to the 13.

Washington State had made two serious threats earlier but interceptions halted them,

and Oregon State's only real serious march also ended with an interception. That came in the fourth period when the up-the-middle Beavers came from their 19 to the Washington State 29. Center Marv Nelson hauled in Paulson's pass and the Beavers could not muster another march.

Before that, their best effort was a move to the Washington State 35 in the first half.
