A Reading Device For the Blind. "Science" reports that under contract with the Veterans Administration the Battelle Memorial Institute of Columbus, Ohio, is testing a new device with which a blind person can read ordinary printed or typewritten material. The instrument looks like a portable radio, and weighs about 9 pounds. There is a small "probe" like a pencil which contains two tiny lights, a lens, and a row of photo cells. As the probe is moved over the page, the sounds that it produces are amplified and passed to the reader's earphones. He hears chords, which vary with every letter of the alphabet. The blind are taught first with a tape recording of the sounds that come out of the instrument. As yet, only five of the machines have been made. Later, it is to be hoped that they will be produced in quantity. Difficulties With Oral Contraceptives. At the last meeting of the American Medical Association, reports were made from the Los Angeles Planned Parenthood Center of the experience of 715 women who tried out the oral method of contraception in which pills are taken. Only 241 women had continued using the method, while 474 had discontinued its use. Some 37 per cent of the women reported distressing side effects, such as digestive disturbances, nausea, or vaginal bleeding. Among the women who said they had kept taking the drug, 9.3 per cent conceived. Evidently, the drug used is not the answer to the problem. A drug of this type is being sought particularly by the health officials in poor and over-populated countries of the Far East where almost starving peasants by the million have one child after another—children for whom no food is available. Infants With the Sex Doubtful. Recently, I pointed out that today, with the giving to many women in the first month or two of pregnancy, of powerful hormones designed to stop a threatening miscarriage, obstetricians are seeing a number of infant girls with their external sex organs much like those of a boy. These organs were modified by the anti-female-sex hormones given the mother. Drs. A. B. Hayles and R. B. Nolan have just reported two such cases from the Mayo Clinic. The reason I will keep commenting on these cases is to emphasize a point I have long been making in this column—the point that when one of these malformed girl babies is mistakenly brought up as a boy who later insists that a miserable mistake was made, which "he" wants rectified by a little operation, we must refuse "him" the right to change; we must not, as we do now, deny a surgeon the right to make the necessary changes, and we must not refuse even to read about such a supposedly "vile and obscene and dirty" business. Let us remember that what happens to an innocent newborn baby cannot possibly be vile. Let us remember, also, that this is a purely medical problem which ought to be left to doctors to handle.

Actors Pallbearers At Producer's Rites. Hollywood (UPI)—Actors Clark Gable and Stewart Granger were among pallbearers Sunday at Jewish funeral services for producer Sam Zimbalist, who died in Rome last Tuesday at the age of 37. Zimbalist started his career as an office boy but went on to produce such film hits as "Tortilla Flat," "30 Seconds Over Tokyo," and his last, "Ber. Hur," the \$13 million remake on which he was working when he died. About 100 persons attended the services for Zimbalist, the latest of several film producers who have died this year. Others included Don Hartman, Jesse L. Lasky, Harry Cohn, Harry Warner, and Mike Todd.

Population Jump Of 100 Million Seen. Washington (UPI)—The government says the U.S. population may jump by nearly 100 million in the next 22 years to 272,600,000 in 1980. It also predicted there would be three million more women than men in 1980. The females now outnumber the men by about 1,500,000. The estimates, released Sunday by the Census Bureau, were based on the assumption that there would be no war, epidemic, major economic depression or other catastrophe which would kill off great numbers of people or sharply reduce the birth rate.

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Youth Killed On Roller Coaster. Long Beach, Calif. (UPI)—A 19-year-old youth was killed Saturday on an amusement park roller coaster when he fainted and his head struck a rail outside the speeding car. George A. Doig, of nearby Torrance, Calif., slipped part way under the safety bar on the side of the roller coaster car after he fainted, police reported. His head extended out of the car and was crushed when it hit a rail.
