Pernicious Anemia

Many persons wonder what pernicious anemia is and what it is due to. There are two main types of anemia, one called secondary and the other primary. Secondary anemia is due to the loss of blood. For instance, a woman came in one day with only 50 per cent of her hemoglobin (the red coloring matter of the blood). She said that every time her bowels moved, she bled from some large piles. Another woman with a low hemoglobin reading said that every month she flowed so heavily that in the next 24 days she just couldn't build back enough blood. Such people need, of course, treatment to stop the great loss of blood, and they need iron rather than vitamins.

People with the primary type of anemia have inherited

something wrong with their blood-forming organs. Any good laboratory expert can tell — often at a glance at a stained smear of the blood — which type of anemia they have. People with primary anemia often know of some relatives who had it. Sometimes the patient gets gray early; he may get numbness and tingling and weakness in his legs; and he may lose his teeth early. A test of the gastric juice will show that it contains no acid. These people must keep taking some vitamin B 12 every month of the rest of their days.

Inheritance Varies

To me, an interesting feature about the children of a person with primary anemia is that some will inherit one part of what we doctors call the syndrome, or group of symptoms, while others may inherit other parts. To show what I mean: A beautiful woman of 32 came into my office one day, and I immediately became interested in her perfectly white hair. I said, "When did you start to get gray?" and she said, "When I was in high school. Others in my family get gray before they are 30." I asked, "Who in the family died of anemia?" And she said, "My mother." I asked, "What is bothering you?" and she said, "I feel weak in my legs; they feel numb and they tingle; I feel terribly tired; I have been losing a little weight, and I have no appetite." Picking up a tuning fork, I put it against her ankles and found that she could not feel the vibration of the fork as a normal person does.

This is a typical finding in patients whose spinal cord is being injured by primary anemia. Interestingly, when I had her blood examined, the laboratory people could see practically nothing wrong with it. She had pernicious anemia with the anemia, much as some few persons have leukemia without the leukemia (huge increase in the number of white blood cells) or epilepsy without the fits. When I put her on Vitamin B 12 she quickly got to feeling like a new woman, and soon was very happy. When I met her several years later, she told me how wonderful it was to feel normal again.

SILVER LINING

Ann Arbor, Mich. — (UPI) — Classroom failures "should be accepted as part of growing up," says University of Michigan professor of education Stanley E. Diamond. "All children fail at times," he reminded parents. "They lose at games; they do not do arithmetic problems correctly; another child reads better, jumps better, wears better clothes. It is probably impossible to mature in our society without experiencing failure. The good is not in the failure but in the overcoming of failure."
