Close Bidding on Highway Projects Seen in Openings

Salem—Extremely close bidding marked bid openings by the State Highway Department here Wednesday with three bidders within \$29 of each other in bids for construction of some highway structures.

State Highway Engineer W. C. Williams said the bids were 13.1 per cent below engineering estimates. Bids opened will be considered for awards at a meeting of the Highway Commission here Dec. 11.

There were only four bidders on the largest project in the letting, involving paving of 2.97 miles on the southwest 11th ave.-Tigard interchange of the Baldock freeway in Portland, Peter Kiewit Sons' Company, Vancouver, Wash., was the apparent low bidder with a bid of \$1,161,017.
