Willamette Tangle Has Limelight

There are two counting games in the Northwest conference this week end but most of the interest centers on champion Willamette's game against Arizona State of Flagstaff.

Willamette, which wrapped up the title last week, travels to Yuma, Ariz., for a Saturday night game with the Arizona team. The two teams are the only unbeaten, untied college football squads on the West Coast.

Willamette is ranked 14th in the nation in the United Press International small college poll and Arizona State is sixth in the same poll.

Conference games send College of Idaho to Linfield and Lewis and Clark to Pacific. Whitman is idle.

Nehring Leads
Jack Nehring of Pacific has moved into first place among Northwest conference ground gainers with 807 yards in 193 tries, compared to 722 yards in 108 tries for Stan Solomon of Willamette. Solomon has the best average among the leaders with a 6.7 per try mark.

Charlie Alvaro of College of Idaho is far ahead in passing with 1100 yards on 82 completions in 172 tries.

Willamette leads in team rushing with 2377 yards, a 297.1 per game mark. Willamette leads in defense by limiting foes to 705 yards from rushing and a total of 1257.

Gary Raid, Willamette tackle, and Nehring were named the lineman and back of the week for last week's play.

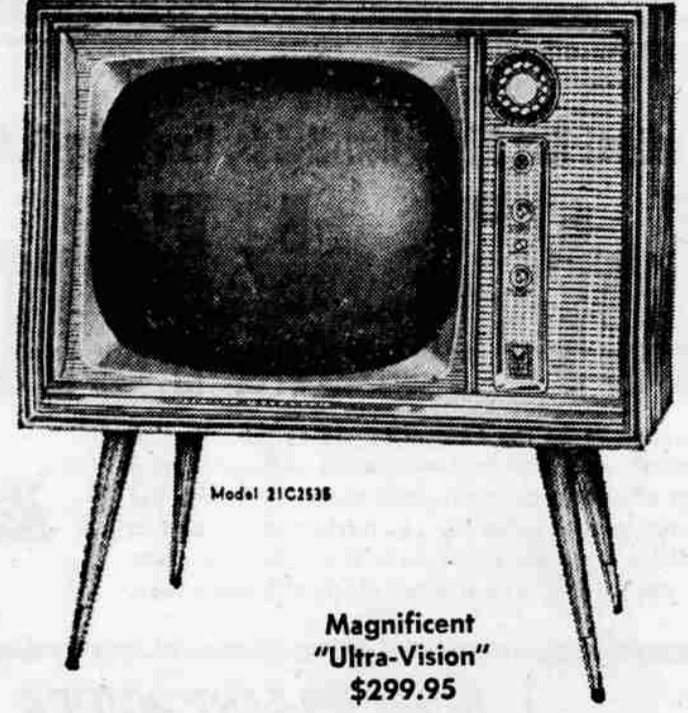

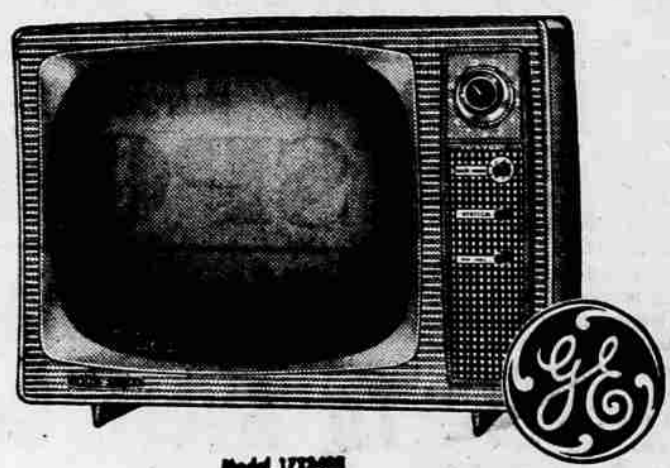

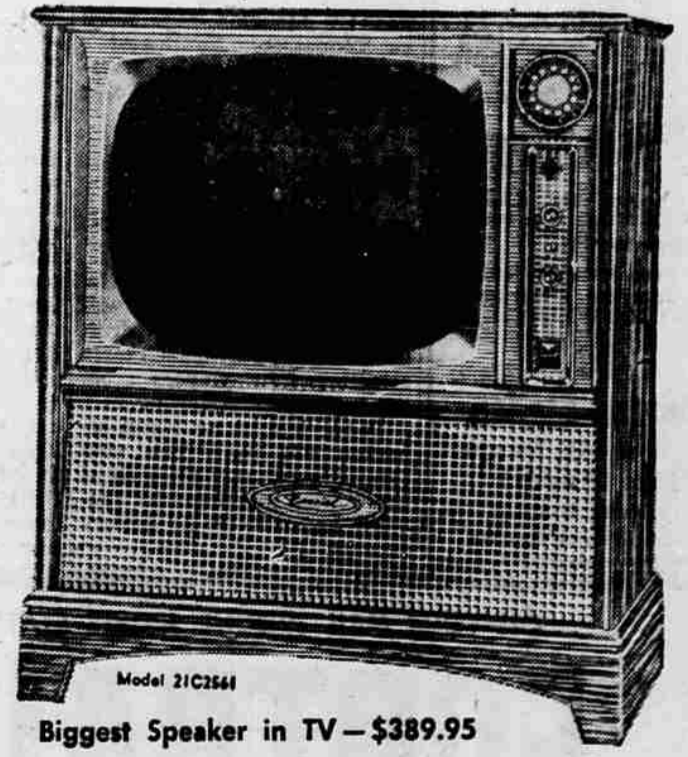
