Medford Travel Study club, an affiliate of the Oregon Federation of Women's clubs, has joined a state-wide campaign to give needy people through the international organization known as CARE.

To collect funds for the project, CARE boxes will be in Leon's, Buster Brown Shoe store, Karls Shoe store, Fasel Real Estate, Johnson-Stewart Shoe store, Home Appliance company, U.S. National Bank, First National bank, Rogue Valley bank, J. Mrs. Clay M. Lee, president of Travel Study club, states that all funds raised will be used to provide CARE self-help packages and equipment for schools and community centers.

In Greece, five million people, over half the population, are trying to earn a living as farmers on the 20 per cent of the land that is arable; the dry, mountainous, rocky land, covers an area smaller than the state of Rhode Island. Almost every pocket in the mountains is planted.

Coming Concert Program Includes 'Peter and Wolf'

The delightful composition "Peter and the Wolf" will be a featured composition on the coming concert of the orchestra of the Philharmonic Society of Southern Oregon. Richard D. Werner will direct, and Angus Bowmer, Ashland, Shakespearean actor, will be narrator. The concert will be given Sunday, November 30, at 3 p.m.

The Prokofiev number, which is sub-titled "Symphonic Tale for Children," was written to teach children to recognize the various instruments of the orchestra, and each character in the story is represented by an instrument or a group of instruments.

The bird is represented by the flute, the duck by the oboe, the cat is played by the clarinet, the grandfather by the bassoon, the wolf by three French horns, Peter by the string section and the shots of the hunters by tympani and bass drum.

Each character of the story also has his characteristic theme. The composition ends with a triumphal march when Peter and his friends lead the captured wolf off to the zoo.
