Klaus Fuchs May Be Deported When Released

London — (UPI) — The Daily Express said Saturday atomic spy Klaus Fuchs almost certainly will be deported as an undesirable alien when he is released from prison in seven months.

The newspaper said the government's interest in detaining Fuchs for political reasons has lessened considerably since Britain started exchanging atomic secrets with the United States two years ago.

The government is willing "to write off the dubious value to the Communists of any still-secret atom bomb information which Fuchs remembers," the newspaper reported.

Convicted in 1950
Fuchs, 48, was convicted in 1950 of turning over top secret atomic information to Russia during the height of the cold war. He was sentenced to 14 years in prison but became eligible for parole after seven years because of his good behavior.

Fuchs, a native of Germany, was stripped of his British citizenship after his conviction.

The German-born scientist was sent to Canada during World War II by the British government but returned after the danger of a German invasion had passed. He studied at Glasgow University and later worked at the Hatwell Atomic Research Station.

In an interview printed Friday by the Daily Express, Fuchs said he would like to return to the Red-held German city of Leipzig, where his father, a professor, is living.

Original Announcement
Britain had originally announced it would find a job for Fuchs when he was released. The Daily Express said this plan has changed. "The government will not risk the public outcry which might ensue if it found work for a German citizen," the paper said.

"Security advisers believe that any criticism from the United States will be less severe if Fuchs is deported as a matter of firm policy than if he is allowed to make his own way to East Germany," the paper said.

LOWER CATASTROPHES
New York — (UPI) — Catastrophes — accidents in which five or more persons are killed — took slightly more than 800 lives in the U. S. during the first six months of 1958, according to the Metropolitan Life Insurance Co. For the corresponding period of 1957, the toll was about 1,200, including at least 350 deaths from Hurricane Audrey in June.

Low Cost Housing Topic for Meeting

Howard Heydlauff, assistant director of the district Portland office of the Federal Housing Administration, will discuss low cost housing for elderly people at a housing conference sponsored by the Rogue Valley Council on Aging at 8 p.m. Monday in the board room at Rogue Valley hospital.

Frank Glonning, chairman of the council, said the meeting will be open to the public, and local officials and representatives of civic organizations, clubs and other organizations have been invited to participate.

Heydlauff was featured speaker on housing for the elderly at a regional conference at Reed college in Portland of 10 northwest states recently.

Glonning will speak briefly on the purpose of the Rogue Valley Council of Aging, which was organized last January. William Hoxie, co-chairman of the housing committee, will outline studies and work of the committee to date. A discussion period will follow Heydlauff's talk.

Five Burglaries Reported Friday

Pilot Rock — (UPI) — Five burglaries were reported here early Friday and the Umatilla county sheriff's office said it believed all were committed by the same persons.

Burglars broke into the Pilot Rock Lumber company, the Maurice Roy Chevrolet Garage, Mentzer Elliott Shell service station, Harry's Welding Shop and Pilot Rock Grocery.

A large quantity of tools was taken from the lumber firm, welding shop and service station and \$1,200 in cash was taken from a safe in the grocery store. The burglars removed a safe from the garage but were unable to get it open, deputies said. It was found abandoned nearby.

11-Year-Old Gets \$65,000 in Damages

Spokane — (UPI) — Superior Court Judge William H. Williams Friday awarded an 11-year-old girl \$65,000 in damages for injuries suffered when she was burned in a bonfire accident in 1955.

The suit was brought to court in 1957 by Mr. and Mrs. Richard Cox for their daughter, Deborah, against Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Hugo. The suit claimed the girl was severely burned while playing around a bonfire built by Hugo's son.

A jury in 1957 denied the damages, but Judge Carl Quackenbush, now retired, ordered a new trial. The case was to go before a jury again, but Judge Williams ordered the award.

Babysitters Freed In Drunk Incident

San Rafael, Calif. — (UPI) — Two male babysitters, accused of getting a two-year-old boy drunk, were freed Friday after the little fellow proved he knew how to serve himself. The sitters, Thomas Preston, 24, and Allen Straight, 21, were arrested when Mrs. Jacqueline Martinez returned home on the night of Oct. 31 and found little Gregory intoxicated.

Preston and Straight insisted the child took a glass of wine from a coffee table while they were in the kitchen preparing a soft boiled egg for him.

District Attorney William O. Weissich decided to try an experiment, with the approval of Mrs. Martinez. He poured three glasses of wine in the Martinez home, took one, gave one to his secretary—and left the third on the coffee table.

Little Gregory was called into the room and immediately made a beeline for the table. He gulped down the small bit of wine and, beaming

at 11:50 a.m., firemen put out a fire at 235 Fifth st. No damage resulted, firemen said.
