Bleeding Piles

People ask about bleeding piles. If they bleed so much that the person is beginning to get anemic, they should quickly be removed surgically. Many experts in this field tell me that the injection treatment is not reliable enough, and so they will not use it. Piles are enlarged veins, and to remove them a surgeon should dissect them out and tie them off. An expert should do the job because if the work is poorly done the anus can be uncomfortable for years afterward.

One thing that a person who thinks he has bleeding piles must always do is to get a thorough examination made of the rectum and the so-called sigmoid bowel just above the rectum. The doctor must look in with a lighted tube. In hundreds of cases seen at the Mayo Clinic, the rectal experts find that a man with a cancer in the rectum has recently been operated on for piles by someone who did not see the growth. He could not have missed it if only he had looked three inches farther up. The fact that a man has bleeding piles does not mean that he cannot have a cancer, too. Many a man has lost his rectum because he did not know that.

I know of no medicine to take by mouth for piles. The suppositories that can be placed in the rectum can be only palliative; they cannot be expected to make any real change in the situation. Many persons can get along for years with piles if they will only keep their bowel movements soft. A laxative that will do this is compound licorice powder.

One thing that all persons with piles should know is to keep away from anyone who advertises himself as a pile specialist. I have seen terrible things happen to people who went to some of the so-called institutes for the treatment of piles. Some of them are run by men who are not doctors of medicine.

When a Woman Gets Fat I constantly get letters from women who say that they are getting fatter and fatter every day, and this they can't understand because they are "very light eaters." All of them are sure that their troubles must be in their glands of internal secretion, such as the thyroid; but as many have to admit, when they went to a big clinic or to a university hospital, no one was able to find anything wrong with their glands.

When a fat woman tells me she is not eating much I can only tell her that one thing is certain and this is that you can't make a stove red-hot without putting a lot of wood or coal into it. Similarly, you can't make a body fat without putting more food into it than is needed for maintenance. If the woman were not eating more than she needs, she wouldn't have much food left over to be stored as fat. I will admit that the bodies of fat persons often seem to be unusually economical—so economical that they can hold their weight when taking half the food a thin man eats.

What must happen to many women who are getting stout, is that while they eat normally enough at meal-times, they fail to realize that they keep nibbling all day; also, they raid the refrigerator before they go to bed. Occasionally, they eat up a two-pound box of chocolates and forget that they did it. I once watched a maid in my home gain some 80 pounds. She did it by nibbling bread and butter all day. I am sure she did not realize that she was eating two or three loaves of bread a day. She was like a heavy smoker who does not realize that he has a cigarette in his mouth.

Human Nature To Cheat There are a few drugs which cut down on the intensity of a person's appetite, but I seldom let my overweight patients take these drugs because it is human nature then to cheat on the diet, hoping that the drug will cover up one's sins. I have to be and I prefer to know that if I cheat it will show on the scales that night. I give myself no alibi. If the scales show that I have gained a pound it means one thing, and this is that I've eaten too much. It means that the next day I have to be especially strict with myself in order to take off the extra pound.

As I say to my patients, in 1910 I learned how to reduce people scientifically. I was taught by a brilliant physician who had learned the then new science of dietetics in a German university. That was 48 years ago, and in all these years practically nothing new has been learned about reducing. I have seen dozens of faddish and quick-change diets come and go, but they were all silly and illogical.

It is useless to go on a diet for a couple of weeks. A stout woman who was born to be heavy, like her parents, must go on a diet for life. If she won't face this fact, I will not take her as a patient. I know of more pleasant ways of wasting my time. And I have never seen the fat rubbed off, or shaken off, or steamed off, or purged off, or exercised off, or wished off!

Salem — The average ex-GI with an Oregon veterans' farm and home loan paid a property tax of \$168 this year, compared to \$145 last year and \$135 in 1956, the Oregon department of veterans' affairs has announced.

In Jackson county, the tax on 531 properties totalled \$90,024.70, while in the state the department paid taxes on 14,915 properties totaling \$2,515,440.
