

Festival Receives Good Will Messages from Many Notables

Ashland — The Oregon Shakespearean Festival building fund campaign is now under way to obtain \$275,000 for construction of a new theater to replace one condemned as hazardous.

Thus far, \$48,606.50 has been contributed to the building fund, building chairmen have reported.

Solicitations for funds were launched last week, when the local campaign started with a "kick off" dinner.

Messages of good will have been received at campaign headquarters.

Prior to the campaign, the Festival received the best wishes of Maurice Evans, internationally acclaimed Shakespearean actor.

Encouragement "from beyond" gave ethereal comfort to the volunteer fund raisers. A telegram from a San Francisco ghost writer remarked:

"Little did I think when Will was working late those nights in Stratford that he would ever be successful enough to have a theatre built for him in Ashland, Oregon. Best wishes." It was signed "Anne Hathaway."

Noted writer Kathleen Norris will be chairman for the Festival's money-raising efforts in the San Francisco Bay region. Mrs. Nion Tucker, prominent in San Francisco social circles, will be co-chairman there.

In her acceptance wire, Kathleen Norris, long a Festival patron, stated: "It makes me very happy to know that all of yours in this work to build a house as fitting as our love and loyalty can make it for the first player and playwright of them all."
