Salem—Steven R. Hess of Medford was one of two in Oregon placing second as outstanding electrician apprentices of the year, according to Stanley Adams, chairman of the Inside Electrical Trade Apprenticeship committee. Placing second with Hess was Robert Ensminger of Salem. First place winner was William R. Shird of Portland. Winners will be presented awards at a banquet in Portland Nov. 29 under the auspices of the Oregon-Columbia chapter of National Electrical Contractors and the state association of electrical workers. About 200 members are expected to attend.

### Savings Bond Sales Show Decline Here

Jackson county residents purchased a total of \$95,014 worth of U.S. savings bonds during October, George W. Minnaugh, state director of savings bond sales, has announced.

Last month's purchases compares with \$108,944 purchased in October, 1957, he noted. Sales through Oct. 31 this year in Jackson county total \$762,000, compared to \$817,223 during the same period last year.
