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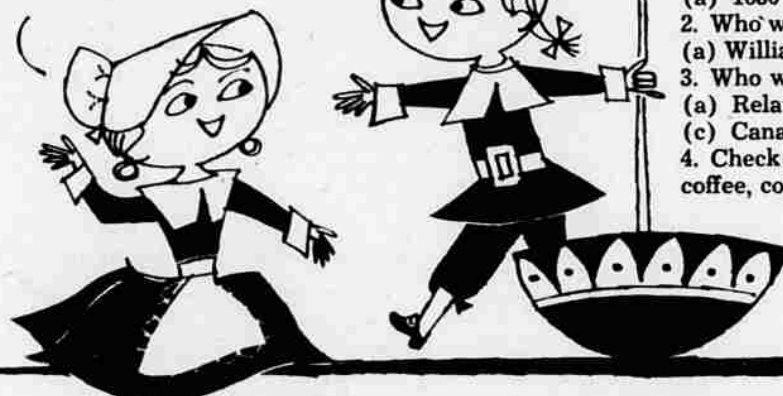

Wizard—a Magic Trick Nat Bradford

The Wizard is the player who is IT. He goes out of the room while the other players select an object for him to guess. The Wizard's Servant has a secret from all the others—except the Wizard. He points out the object with a long stick.

"Is it this, O Wizard?" he asks.

Just before he gets to the right object he points to something like a table, chair, sofa, or bed that has *four legs*. The next object, he and the Wizard know, is the right one.

(Another way to play this game is for the Servant to point to something red just before he gets to the object chosen.)
