Soviet Ambassador Andrei Smirnov last week said in Bonn (the capital of the West German Republic):
"The Russians are going to GIVE BERLIN BACK TO THE GERMANS by Christmas."

TAKE down your Bible. Turn to Genesis, the 27th chapter and the 22nd verse. You will find these words:

"And Jacob went near unto Isaac his father; and he felt him and said: The voice is Jacob's voice, but the hands are the hands of Esau."

YOU have there the whole story. Jacob was practicing a deception.

So is Smirnov. What he says sounds very good indeed. What he SAYS is that the former capital of all of Germany is going to be given back to the Germans.

What he MEANS is that Russia is proposing to give West Berlin, a little island of Western freedom, back to the communist carpetbaggers who took over all of Germany east of the Elbe river and have made of it a communist satellite.

That's a horse of another color.

IN WASHINGTON the White House, in the face of Russian threats to upset the four-power occupation of Berlin, says the American government "WILL PERSIST IN ITS FIRM INTENTION to maintain the integrity of West Berlin."

WHAT WILL come of it? It's hard to say.

In both cases, one never can tell what will happen.

BUT THIS, I think, can be said:

In the case of the recent bluffing in the Formosa strait, the American people as a whole were unwilling to run the risk of war for the tiny island of Quemoy. They made their feeling rather plain at that time.

But West Berlin is different. The principle that is at stake there is one that the American people will be ready to go to war to defend if there is no other way out.

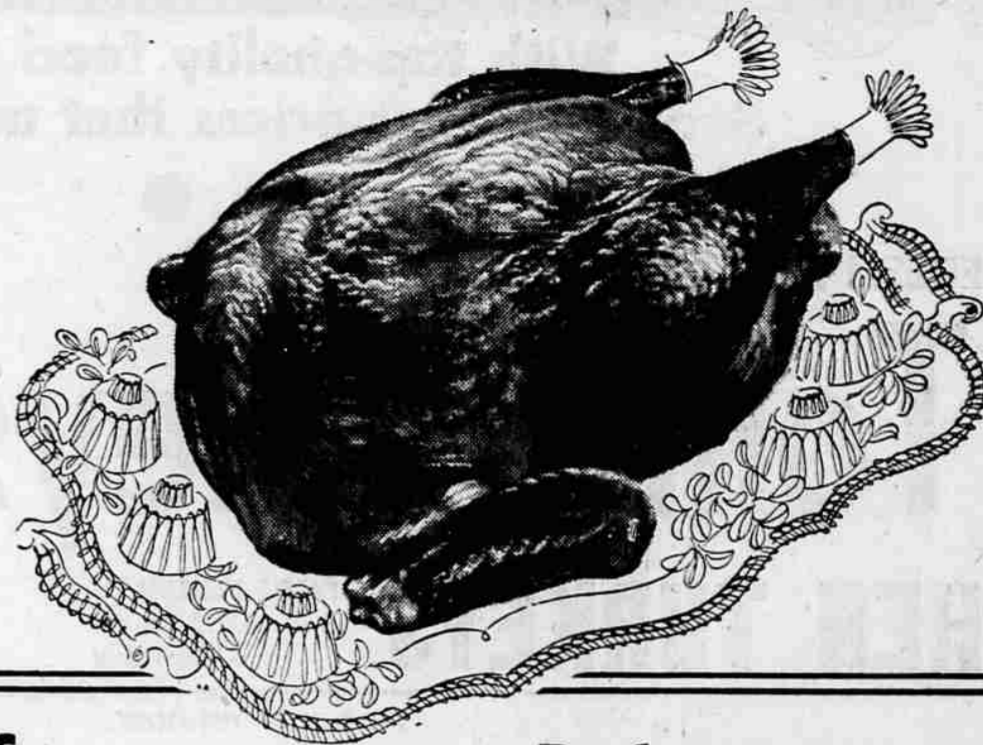
