Squaw Valley Only Small Time Stuff To Backers Of Mt. Shasta Ski Bowl

By HAL WOOD San Francisco - (UP) - Squaw Valley gets all the publicity on winter sports these days - but the people in the little city of Dunsmuir, Calif., (pop. 2,500), the 1960 home of the Winter Olympic Games is strictly small-time stuff.

Bill Wade Bidding for Pass Toga

Philadelphia - (UP) - Billy Wade of the Los Angeles Rams is making a determined bid for the passing championship of the National Football league.

Wade jumped from fifth to second place two weeks ago and remained in that runner-up spot behind little Eddie Le Baron of Washington after his efforts last Sunday. Wade has an average gain of 8.45 yards, compared to 9.02 for the Redskins' quarterback.

Le Baron has tossed 110 passes, completing 59 for 992 yards and nine touchdowns. Wade has thrown 262, clicking on 140 for 2,214 yards and 13 touchdowns.

Jimmy Brown of Cleveland made his poorest showing last week, gaining only 66 yards, but increased his record total to 1,229 yards. The performance dropped his average to 6.2 in 199 attempts.

Alan Ameche, the Baltimore Colts powerhouse, continued to trail Brown with 607 yards as Joe Perry of San Francisco moved from fifth to third place with 567.

Retzlaff Sets Pace Palmer Retzlaff of the Philadelphia Eagles, who caught only 10 passes last season, is setting the 1958 pace with 43 snares for 600 yards and two touchdowns. Del Shofner of Los Angeles grabbed eight aerials last Sunday to ease into second place with 40. Ray Berry of Baltimore slipped from second to third place with 39.

Brown failed to gain a point last week but still has a 30-point edge over Lenny Moore of Baltimore, 102 to 72. Willie Galimore of the Chicago Bears is third with 66.

Sam Baker of the Redskins improved his punting average slightly and now has a 45.9 norm, tops in the league. Don Chandler of New York is second with 44.4, followed by the 43.3 average of Green Bay's Max McGee.

Jon Arnett of Los Angeles held his lead in punt returns with a 14.1 average. Bob Mitchell, Cleveland, was second with 10.4.

Leonard Lyles is first in kickoff returns with a 40.8 average, while a 101-yard return by Ollie Matson of the Chicago Cardinals last week pushed him from ninth to second with a 31.1 average.

Andy Nelson of Baltimore and Jim Patton of New York are tied in pass interceptions with eight each.

they've invested two million dollars in a winter and summer sports playground that they claim is situated in the biggest, most beautiful and highest ski area in the country.

It's the Mt. Shasta ski bowl and it has a run on it whereby a skier can coast 14 miles downhill without a stop. That certainly must be a downhill record.

One of the leaders in the development of the bowl is Chapman Wentworth, editor and publisher of a little weekly at Dunsmuir.

A Little Drive "We are sold on this becoming a great sports place," says Wentworth. "The people in our city all have invested in it. We have 1,483 stockholders. We put on a little drive and in 10 weeks we had pledged \$500,000. Two weeks later we had the whole half million dollars in the bank."

How can this site, which is 260 miles north of San Francisco support an investment of two million dollars?

"We don't expect any trouble at all," said Wentworth. "We have one of the few ski bowls with chair lift that is right on a major tourist highway. There are 500,000 tourists use this highway every year. The lift will run the year 'round. If we do \$300,000 of business each year, we'll be okay."

The heights for the area could make one dizzy. The lodge is at 7,850 feet; the top of the current ski lift is 9,388 feet; and a new one, to be built, will go up to 11,150 feet.

Snow Or Water At the same time there is snow on Mt. Shasta, water skiing fans can cavort on smooth waters right beside the highway.

"I don't think there is another place like it in the world," says Wentworth. "But one of the major attractions may be that 14-mile slide down the hill. It is not a difficult ski trip, but it is not for novices, either."

Cincinnati Ends Knick Streak

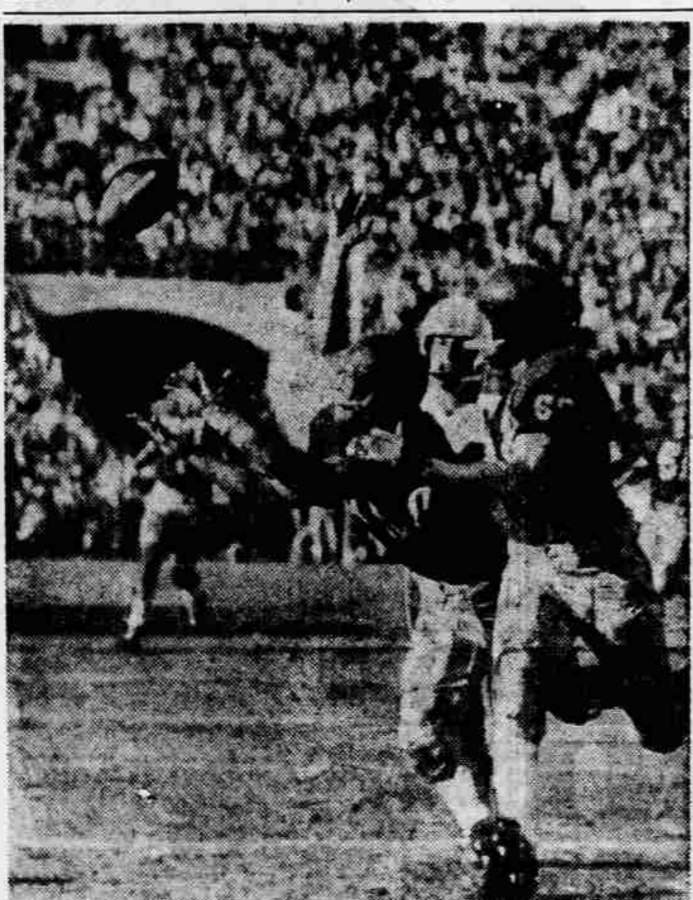

Phil Tops Rawlings

Portland - (UP) - Phil Moyer of Portland won a split decision over Chicago's Luther Rawlings Tuesday night in a middleweight fight here.

Moyer, weighing 153, overcame an early Rawlings lead to win the last five rounds by wide margins. Rawlings, 151, continually punched Moyer with sharp lefts but the 20-year-old Portlander connected with solid rights to the head in the later rounds to win the 10-round decision.

Moyer had Rawlings spewing blood from the mouth from the opening round and also opened cuts in the seventh and tenth rounds.

Paul Dietzel Coach of Week

Baton Rouge, La. - (UP) - He was a student of three of the most famous coaches in football - but he refused to imitate any of them and his "be yourself" planning has produced this season's only major perfect record team.

He found a way to make boys proud of the fact they're on the third team rather than the first team, and he credits their spirit with helping carry the squad to a berth in the Sugar Bowl.

He is Paul Dietzel of Louisiana State, honored today as the United Press International "Coach of the Week" in the wake of State's 62-0 rout of Tulane to cap a perfect 10-0 campaign and nail down the bowl berth.

Fourth Year Dietzel, 34-year-old native of Mansfield, Ohio, brought Louisiana State to the pigskin pinnacle in his fourth year at the helm, the first in which he could call on experienced players (juniors) that were his own recruits.

And Skipper Paul commands a crew especially high-spirited because of the way he has assembled them. Dietzel doesn't have "first, second and third" teams. His best players are on the "white" team; of the 22 squad members left, the 11 best at offense play on the "go, go, go" team; the remaining 11 become defensive specialists nicknamed "the Chinese bandits," because Dietzel once heard that Chinese bandits are ferocious.

SHRINERS BID COUGARS Spokane - (UP) - Washington State football stars Bob Newman and Bill Steiger have been invited to play in the East-West Shrine game in San Francisco New Year's Day. Steiger and Newman will play in the Shrine contest unless WSC receives a bid to play in some other post-season game. The Cougars are shopping for a berth in either the Sugar or the 'Gator bowls.

Banks Earns National Loop's Most Valuable Player Award

By BOB SALMON Boston - (UP) - Shortstop Ernie Banks of the Chicago Cubs, a rawboned home run specialist, today joined a select and starry group of Negroes who have dominated the National league's Most Valuable Player award over the past decade.

The 27-year-old Banks did it in grand style, winning the annual balloting by baseball writers announced here Tuesday in runaway fashion.

Banks polled 283 points, highest total in four years. Outfielder Willie Mays of the San Francisco Giants was 98 points behind in second place. Hank Aaron of the pennant-winning Milwaukee Braves, was third with 166 points.

The long, lean Banks, a 6-1, 175-pound spindle of sinew, was the sixth straight member of his race to win the league's highest award. Since 1947, when Jackie Robinson became the first Negro to play major league baseball, Negroes have won the MVP award eight times.

Robinson captured it in 1949. Roy Campanella won it in 1951 and again in 1953. Since then, it has been Mays, Campanella, Don Newcombe, Aaron and Banks—a remarkable record and a tribute to Negroes the world over.

"Ooohhh, man!" exclaimed Banks jubilantly when he reached at his Chicago home with the news. "Isn't that something! I'm tickled to death."

His manager, Bob Schef-

ling, said from his Phoenix, Ariz., home that "I wish I had eight more like him."

Scheffing added that Banks, who has belted more home runs than any other shortstop in National League history, "still hasn't reached his potential as far as hitting is concerned. I'm for him all the way. He never gives anybody trouble."

Banks was on a fifth-placetying club last season but his hitting and fielding exploits could hardly be overlooked. The Dallas, Tex., native set a major league record for shortstops with 47 homers, collected 193 hits for 379 total bases, drove in 129 runs and batted a cool .313.

Excellent Fielder Banks led the league in both home runs and runs batted in. His fielding, often overshadowed by his slugger, was considered excellent. Some experts compared him with Marty Marion. Others mentioned the unassuming Banks in the same sentence with the immortal Honus Wagner.

Banks garnered 16 of the 24 possible first place votes, each worth 14 points in the balloting by the Baseball Writers Association of America. He drew four votes for second place, one for third and one each for fifth, sixth and seventh.

The other eight first-place

votes were divided by Mays (3), Frank Thomas of Pittsburgh (2), and Warren Spahn of the Braves, Bill Mazerowski of the Pirates and Bob Skinner of the Pirates, one each.
