Domiciliary Needs Topic of Meeting

The Camp White Domiciliary needs the interest of the community and an active and strong volunteer program to help the professional staff there, stressed Robert Kelly, chief of social services at Camp White domiciliary.

Kelly, addressing a recent meeting of the Inter-Agency Council of Jackson County, said the staff already appreciates the help being given now by various organizations and committees.

He also explained the purpose of the Domiciliary which is to provide a place to live for eligible disabled veterans and services such as limited medical care and rehabilitation.

Although the hospital maintains an average daily member load of 925 there are several on the waiting list. Camp White is one of the three veteran administration homes that provide hospital care for its men, Kelly said.

The December meeting of the Inter-Agency council will be a discussion of the unmet needs of the community. Discussion will be led by Miss Celia Walker of the Jackson County welfare department and Capt. William Ricker, chairman of the group. The meeting will be held in the Salvation Army shelter.

Knutson Drops Alienation Suit

Washington — UP — Andy Knutson has dropped a suit he had filed as the aggrieved husband of Rep. Coya Knutson (D-Minn.) but was disclosed to have launched a separate action as her allegedly unpaid landlord.

The clerk's office in federal district court here said the 50-year-old Okla. Minn. hotel keeper withdrew a \$200,000 suit, charging slander and alienation of his wife's affections, against her 30-year-old secretary, William Kjeldahl.

Knutson's lawyer, Benedict Fitzgerald Jr., said the withdrawal was carried out improperly and without consulting him. But he said his client's dearest wish is a reconciliation with the 45-year-old Coya, who lost her congressional seat in the Nov. 4 election, and that he hopes this is in prospect.

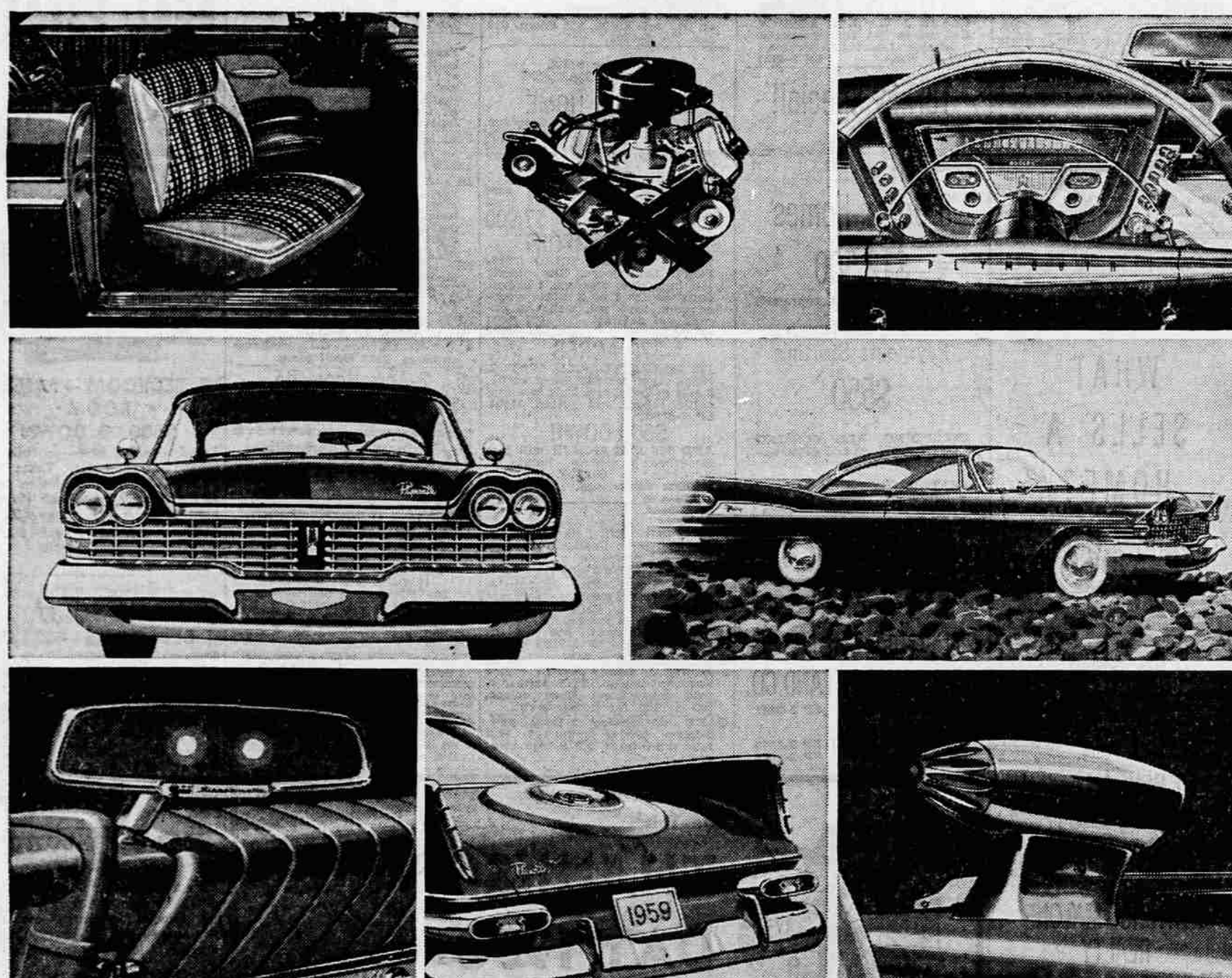
