Augusta, Ga.—(UPI)—President Eisenhower, winding up a 13-day golfing vacation here, today called two high level meetings at the White House Wednesday to deal with vital sections of his program for the new Congress. The chief executive, who will take off for Washington Tuesday afternoon, called a meeting of the National Aeronautic Space Council at 9 a.m. Wednesday. One of the key items pending before the council is whether the Army must give over its top scientific staff of missile experts to the civilian National Aeronautics and Space Administration.
