

Rumplestiltskin Slated For Medford and Ashland

Ashland — Five performances of "Rumplestiltskin," the fall presentation of the Southern Oregon College players, will be presented in Medford and Ashland. The first performance will be Saturday, December 6, at 10 a.m. in Churchill hall, and another daytime performance for Ashland will be December 13 at 10 a.m. in the same hall.

The Medford performances will be Wednesday, December 10 at 2:30 p.m. and 4:15 p.m. at the Craterian theater. These performances are sponsored by Medford branch, American Association of University Women and tickets will be on sale in the schools December 9-10 during the noon hour.

Two additional campus performances will be Thursday and Friday, December 11-12 in Churchill hall auditorium. Dr. Dorothy Stolp of the SOC speech department is directing the play with the aid of two student directors, Florence Moore and Barbara Moltenbach, both of Ashland.

Leads Listed

Michael Johnson has been chosen to play the lead role of Rumplestiltskin, in the production. Young Johnson, who comes from Sitka, Alaska, has had previous acting experience, having appeared as the young son in "The Happy Journey" and as a twelve-year old boy in the SOC summer session play. An accomplished pianist, Johnson has played for many campus assemblies and talent shows.

Joan Taylor will appear as the miller's daughter who becomes queen in the forthcoming play. Miss Taylor is new to the SOC stage. She transferred to SOC from Eastern Oregon college where she played the part of Hilda Miller in "Plain and Fancy."

Pat Leek of Medford and James Cunningham of Malin play two of the major supporting roles in Rumplestiltskin. Cunningham, a sophomore, is cast as the miller; he has had experience acting in several high school plays.

Miss Leek, also a sophomore, will play the role of the miller's wife. Her previous acting experience includes: the role of Little Bo Peep in "Babes in Toyland"; the part of a young country girl in the Medford high school opera, "Up Old Smokey," and the role of Cinderella in the SOC production of Cinderella last year.

Playing the roles of the king and the king's son are Norman Gober and Steven Wisely. Gober, from Klamath Falls, appeared in many high school plays and directed two one-act plays. Wisely is from Medford.

Other members of the cast include: Glenna Brewold, Medford; Mother Hilda; David Bowdoin, Ashland; Inger; George Brown, Applegate; Gothol; Charlotte Riley, Medford; Karen; and Carolyn Edwards, Gold Hill, the nurse.

Mary Lee Sheldon, Glide; Faye Shearer, Cloverdale and Leilani Kunkel, Medford, are the ladies-in-waiting, while Michael Fuhrer, Medford, and Jack McLennan, Winston, are the pages.

Matinee performances will also be given in both Ashland and Medford.

Sauce for Broccoli

New York—A new way to serve broccoli—with vinaigrette sauce. 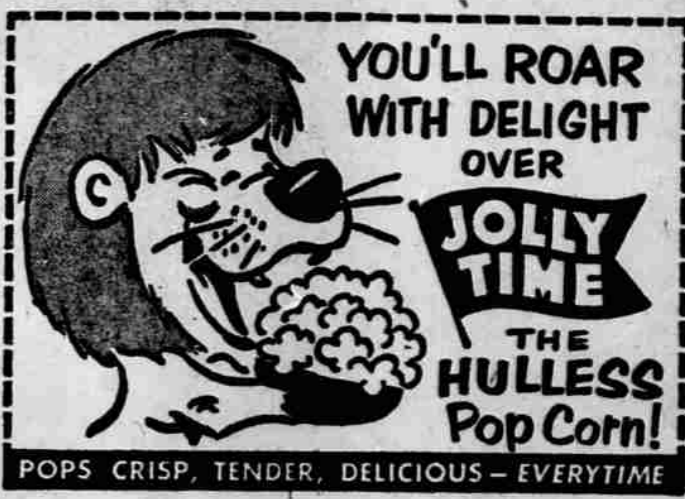
