Guardsman Innocent Of Manslaughter
Goldendale, Wash. — (UP)—A Superior Court jury Wednesday found Harry T. Ingalls, 23, a Coast Guardsman from Yakima, innocent of a charge of manslaughter.

Ingalls was charged specifically with firing the shot which killed Mrs. Loretta Shelton, 32, Oct. 13, while he was deer hunting near the woman's ranch northwest of here.

Drivers Licenses Suspended Listed

Salem — The department of motor vehicles has released names of 314 drivers whose licenses were ordered suspended during the period beginning Nov. 24 and ending Nov. 28.

Length of suspension varies, depending on charges involved, recommendation of court, discretionary action by the department or requirements of Oregon law. The department said some of the licenses involving financial responsibility and court recommendations may have been reinstated after suspension was ordered.

The department warned drivers that the penalty for driving while suspended is a jail sentence of no less than two days and up to six months, and there may be imposed a fine up to \$500. Under licensing procedures, this will also result in an additional year of suspension.

Editor's note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual report. The Family Council does not give advice; it merely reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Mark L.—My wife and I have been a devoted couple. We have been married nearly 20 years, but did not have a child until eight years ago—mainly due to the financial and health problems that have plagued us since we were married.

These problems started lessening, but worse ones took their place. The work I finally settled into pays well, but is very frustrating to me. I was not cut out for it and feel that I would be much more successful at something else.

Salem —(UP)—Oregon courts reported 11,812 driver convictions during November, the Department of Motor Vehicles announced Thursday.

The figure was nearly 1,000 more than were reported for the same period in 1957.

Some 247 persons received mandatory license suspensions for driving while intoxicated.
