



PROPOSED DISTRICT - This map indicates proposed boundaries for a downtown assessment district that would help pay off off-street parking bonds. Hearings on the district would follow a green light from voters Wednesday authorizing the city to pledge its full faith and credit behind the bonds. It would eventually be established by city council ordinance. Properties within the district would be assessed on the basis of benefit, depending on

their distance from the parking facility. Shown in this map, near the center, is the proposed "Keeney Plan" self-parking platform straddling the Southern Pacific railroad tracks. Officials estimate that the assessment for a lot with 25-foot frontage near the facility, based on a 20-year retirement period for the bonds, would run under \$40. Properties further away, near the edges of the district, would be assessed at lesser rates.
