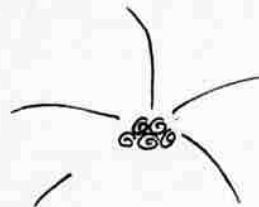

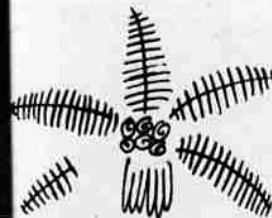
Let's Draw a Palm Tree

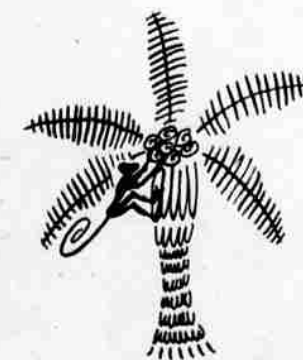


Opening beneath the sun,
