

# Two Americans To Receive Red Hats At Consistories Beginning Dec. 15

 Vatican City - (UPI) - Two Americans and a foreign visitor to the United States will receive the red hats of princes of the church at the consistories beginning here Dec. 15. They will bring to 28 the number of cardinals who have served the church in the United States.

Scheduled to receive their red hats from Pope John XXIII are two American-born archbishops, the Most Rev. Richard James Cushing of Boston and the Most Rev. John O'Hara of Philadelphia, and one Italian who was serving as apostolic delegate to the U.S., the Most Rev. Amleto Giovanni Cicognani.

The new cardinals will bring to six the number of church princes still living or served in America. The others are:

Francis Cardinal Spellman, archbishop of New York.  
 James Francis Cardinal McIntyre, archbishop of Los Angeles.  
 Pietro Cardinal Fumasoni Biondi, Italian-born former apostolic delegate to the U.S., now serving in the Roman curia as head of the church's Sacred Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith.

Italians who have served as apostolic delegates in the U.S. and later became princes of the church, like Fumasoni Biondi, are often listed by Catholic publications as among the "American" cardinals.

## Irradiated Food Tests to Continue

Corvallis—Tests on whether irradiated foods are wholesome and safe to eat will be extended into the sixth year at Oregon State college this winter with a new \$28,750 grant from the office of the surgeon general, department of the Army.

White rats are used as test animals. They are being fed pork, peaches, carrots and jam irradiated for preservation at the Idaho Falls, Ida., atomic energy installation.

Irradiated foods will keep for vastly longer periods than others and do not require refrigeration. They show considerable promise for military and home use in the future.

To date in the OSC tests, no differences whatever have been found between rats on irradiated and non-irradiated diets. Length of life, weight gains, body tissue composition, and number of offspring are compared. Dr. Edward C. Bubl, agricultural chemist, is leader of the project. Since it was started in 1954, OSC has received grants totaling more than \$200,000 for the tests.

## Station Wagon Said Taken from Local Lot

Edward Cardinal Mooney, 1947; born Mount Savage, Md., 1832; apostolic delegate to India, then Japan; bishop of Rochester, N.Y., 1933-37; archbishop of Detroit, 1937 until death this year on first day of conclave which elected Pope John XXIII.

Francis Cardinal Spellman, 1946; born Whitman, Mass., 1889; auxiliary bishop of Boston, 1932-39; archbishop of New York, 1939 to present.

James Francis Cardinal McIntyre, 1953; born New York City, 1886; auxiliary bishop of New York, 1941-48; coadjutor, archbishop of New York, 1948-49; archbishop of Los Angeles, 1949 to present.

Of the other foreign-born cardinal with American ties, Camillo Cardinal Mazella of Italy was a Jesuit teacher in New York during the latter years of the 19th century. Joseph Cardinal Vives y Tuto of Spain served the church in California.

Gaetano Cardinal Bedini of Italy, a church prince of the mid-1800s, served as a special papal envoy to America.

Cardinals Giovanni Bonzano, Diomedeo Falconio, Sebastiano Martinelli and Francesco Satolli, all of Italy, were once apostolic delegates to the U.S. Cardinals Bonaventura Cerretti, Francesco Marchetti-Selvaggiani and Donato Sbarretti, also Italians, were auditors of the apostolic delegation in the U.S.

John Cardinal Glennon, 1946; born Ireland, 1862; archbishop of St. Louis, 1903 until death in 1946. Died on way home from consistory which made him cardinal.

Samuel Cardinal Stritch, 1946; born Nashville, Tenn., 1887; bishop of Toledo, Ohio, 1921-30; archbishop of Milwaukee, 1930-39; archbishop of Chicago, 1939 until this year, when came to Rome to take high Vatican post but died.

John Cardinal Farley, 1911; born in Ireland, 1842; bishop of New York, 1895; archbishop of New York, 1902 until his death in 1918.

William Henry Cardinal O'Connell, 1911; born Lowell, Mass., 1859; rector, North American College in Rome, 1895-1901; bishop of Portland, Maine, 1901-1905; special papal envoy to Japan, 1905; archbishop of Boston, 1907 until his death in 1944.

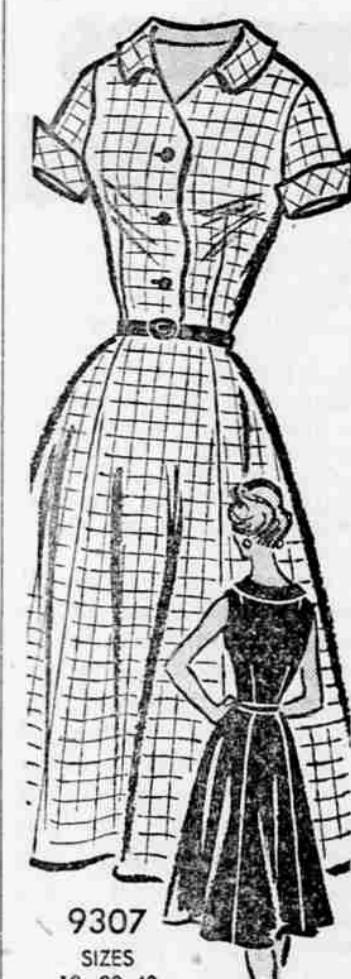
Dennis Cardinal Dougherty, 1921. Born Girardville, Pa., 1865; bishop of Nueva Segovia, and Jaro, Philippine Islands; bishop of Buffalo, N.Y., 1915-18; archbishop of Philadelphia, 1918 until his death in 1951.

George Cardinal Mundelein, 1924; born New York City, 1872; auxiliary bishop of Brooklyn; archbishop of Chicago, 1915 until death in 1939.

Patrick Cardinal Hayes, 1924; born New York City, 1867; chief chaplain U.S. Army and Navy, World War I; archbishop of New York, 1919 until death in 1938.

John Cardinal Glennon, 1946; born Ireland, 1862; archbishop of St. Louis, 1903 until death in 1946. Died on way home from consistory which made him cardinal.
