Increase in Fees Considered Here

Members of the Medford Realty board are actively considering an increase in their fees from a standard 5 per cent to 6 per cent, it was reported today.

This news came in the wake of action by the Portland Realty Board this week to raise fees by a similar amount effective Jan. 1.

The Medford board is expected to take similar action within a few days.

In Portland, the board voted to increase its commission schedule for selling single-family residential property to 6 per cent of the sales price, with a minimum commission of \$400. Present rates are 5 per cent with a \$200 minimum.

The Portland commission for unimproved lots was raised from 5 to 10 per cent, with the minimum of \$100 unchanged.

Similar increases have been taken by other boards in Oregon and Washington, following recommendation for such action by the Oregon Association of Real Estate Boards at its annual meeting this fall.

The Portland board cited the rising costs of advertising and selling property, and said it would help attract and hold qualified people in the real estate field.

Commission rates on other classes of property were unchanged.
