Change in Route Of Highway 101 Given Approval

Salem - (UPI) - The State Highway Commission Thursday gave tentative approval to a route different from its original choice on relocating Highway 101 between Astoria and Seaside.

The Commission went on record as favoring the so-called Lewis and Clark route over the Smith Point route. The newly-approved route is longer but cheaper.

The action was taken after study of an engineering and economic survey and on recommendation of W. C. Williams, state highway engineer. Final determination will be made after a public hearing.

Requires Draw Span

The Lewis and Clark route would follow the general route of an old highway east of the Lewis and Clark river and would connect with the present Highway 101 about two miles north of Seaside. The Smith Point route would require a draw span bridge paralleling the railroad bridge across Youngs bay.

Cost of the Lewis and Clark route is estimated at \$4,497,000. Cost of the other is estimated at \$6,644,000.

Safecrackers Take \$20,000

Portland - (UPI) - Safecrackers early today escaped with an estimated \$20,000 in silver and currency from the Can-Teen Company of Oregon on southeast Milwaukee avenue, police reported.

Detectives said the burglars used considerable force to pry open a steel door on the side of the building to gain entrance.

The safe was located in an office. It was pushed to a rear room where yeggs worked with a burning torch outfit. This apparently failed, police said, because the torch was equipped with a welding tip and would not cut. The combination was then knocked off the double doors and they were "punched" open, officers said.

Money was contained in sacks and boxes and police said the cash probably weighed several hundred pounds.

Most of the money was in silver.

Estimate of loss was made by John R. Estey, manager of the firm.
