The New York Giants, busy proving you can go a long way with spirit, strong defense and a crippled kicker, are slim, 11-10 choices to defeat the Cleveland Browns next Sunday in a play-off for the National Football League's Eastern division title at Yankee Stadium.

Pat Summerall, who hadn't kicked all last week because of an injured right leg, booted a 49-yard field goal with only 2:17 to go, Sunday on the same field. That kick, twirling true through falling

snow, provided a 13-10 victory over the Browns and forced a play-off game for Eastern honors and the right to entertain the Baltimore Colts in the NFL championship game Dec. 28.

The two rivals are rated so even that oddsmakers tabbed the Giants 11-10 favorites in

the "early line" for next Sunday.
Other scores Sunday included Washington 20, Philadelphia 0; Chicago Bears 21, Detroit 16; Los Angeles 34, Green Bay 20; San Francisco 21, Baltimore 12. On Saturday Pittsburgh won the Chicago Cards 38-21.

Baltimore Leads Pro Selections

St. Louis — (UPI) — The Baltimore Colts dominated the all-star selections announced today by the Sporting News for the National Football league.

The Colts placed eight players on offense and defense platoons of the Western division of the pro football circuit.

Baltimore quarterback Johnny Unitas was named the signal caller of the Western division and Bobby Layne of the Pittsburgh Steelers was chosen quarterback of the Eastern division.

The Cleveland Browns and New York Giants had six positions apiece and the Los Angeles Rams placed five men. The Chicago Bears, the Steelers and Washington Redskins came up with three each. The Philadelphia Eagles, Chicago Cardinals, Detroit Lions, San Francisco Forty Niners and Green Bay Packers had two apiece.

The East team backfield consisted of Layne, Ollie Matson of the Cardinals, Frank Gifford of the Giants, and Jimmy Brown of the Browns.

With Unitas for the West were Jon Arnett of the Rams and Lenny Moore of the Colts, plus fullback Joe Perry of the Forty Niners.

Coaches, scouts, writers and officials in the two sections were consulted by the Sporting News in compilation of the teams.

Offensive line selections on the West team included Bob St. Clair of the Forty Niners at tackle, Del Shofner of the Rams at end, and Duane Putnam of the Rams at guard.

Rams chosen for the defensive team were linebacker Les Richter, and back Will Sherman.

Rejection of Soviet Ultimatum On Berlin Made
Paris — (UPI) — A tough Allied stand on West Berlin and rejection of a Communist ultimatum to quit the city or face possible war gave renewed hope today to West Germany that East-West talks may yet reunite the divided country.

The American, British and French foreign ministers met Sunday with the West German foreign minister and issued a communique reaffirming their intention to remain in West Berlin and to have free access to the city — advance rejection of any blockade attempt.

Week of Meetings
The Sunday talks began a week of important NATO meetings. Most important of these is the three-day session of the NATO council opening Tuesday. Today there was a series of lesser meetings including U. S. — Canadian defense talks.

The four ministers did not reply formally to Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev's Thanksgiving day note demanding that West Berlin be turned into a "free city" with all Allied troops withdrawn. But they stated their position in words so clear there could be no doubt of their firm intentions.

The four foreign ministers will meet Tuesday with the entire NATO council of ministers to discuss a reply to Khrushchev.

Flame Ceramics Gives Lift To Golfers

Long Grass Said To Encourage Mold
Minneapolis — (UPI) — A University of Minnesota horticulturist has some tips for bringing your flowers and lawn through the winter in fine shape.

C. G. Hard said that if grass is left to grow too long it will encourage snow mold in the spring. Therefore, he said, cut it until it stops growing.

As for flowers, Hard said to bring in your geraniums, chrysanthemums and begonias before the first freeze. He suggested replanting the geraniums indoors and storing other flower bulbs in a cool, dry place.

Your roses still come through better if you mound them up with dirt to about a foot around the crown of the plant. Hard recommended spraying them with a fungicide but not to water them.

New Hampshire Has 'Unknown Soldier'

South Stoddard, N. H. — (UPI) — New Hampshire has an "Unknown Soldier" all its own. The young Union soldier of the Civil War rests in the Stevens family lot in the South Stoddard village graveyard where he was buried more than 90 years ago.

There is no official recognition of his grave other than the regulation Army marker of the Civil War period — an upright slab with "U. S. Soldier" inscribed in a medallion.

Window Insulation Not Sufficient

Mechanicsburg, Pa. — (UPI) — Insulating the windows of a house alone is like plugging a hole with a sieve, according to a manufacturer of aluminum insulating windows and doors.

It may help somewhat in reducing heat loss, said Harold Waugh of the Capitol Products Corp., "but it is still very much like trying to plug a hole in a dike with a sieve."
