### Cardinals Attend First Consistory

Vatican City—(UPI)—The new cardinals of the Roman Catholic church attend their first consistory today to receive their red hats from Pope John XXIII.

It was the first of three consistories at which the new princes of the church were to be awarded the symbols of their office. The other signs of rank were the cardinals' rings, titles and scarlet robes. Twenty of the 23 new cardinals named by the Pope last month and approved in a secret consistory Monday join the cardinals of previous creation for the ceremonies in the ornate Consistorial hall of the Apostolic Palace.

Among them are the new American cardinals Richard Cardinal Cushing, archbishop of Boston, and John Cardinal O'Hara, archbishop of Philadelphia.

The three non-attending new cardinals receive their red birettas, squared-angled hats, from the Catholic chiefs of state of the nations in which they serve.

### 'Vigorous Action' Seen in Alford's Bid for House Seat

Washington—(UPI)—Rep. Kenneth B. Keating (R-N.Y.) predicted today the special House Elections Committee would "take vigorous action" on complaints against segregationist Dale Alford's write-in defeat of Rep. Brooks Hays (D-Ark.).

Keating declined to elaborate. But other sources speculated the committee might go so far as to recommend that the new Congress refuse to seat Alford until a thorough investigation of his election has been conducted.

The committee called a closed meeting to decide on what action to take as House Democrats at least tentatively excluded the Little Rock segregationist from their ranks. They did not invite him to the Democratic Party caucus Jan. 6, paving the way for an almost certain showdown vote on whether to admit him at

### POLISH POLITICIAN DIES

Warsaw—(UPI)—Vladyslaw Kowalski, veteran member of the central committee of the United Peasant Party and a former Polish cabinet minister, died here last Sunday, it was disclosed today.

The committee planned to decide whether to conduct a formal investigation of charges that fraud and conspiracy figured in Alford's last minute campaign against Hays, the veteran congressman who assumed the role of a moderate mediator in Little Rock's segregation troubles. Several committee members said there was no doubt the committee would decide to go ahead with the investigation.

However, any decision to recommend that Congress temporarily refuse to seat Alford was expected to come on a split vote. The committee is made up of two Northern Republicans, one Northern Democrat and two Southern Democrats.

Meantime, Alford left the capital for Little Rock, shrugging off the troubles that appeared to be mounding in his path to the House.

### Labor's Attempt To Withdraw Students Rapped

Portland—(UPI)—The Rev. Willis L. Whalen, principal of Central Catholic high school, Tuesday, rapped the Multnomah County Labor Council for trying to induce parents to withdraw their children from the school over a labor dispute.

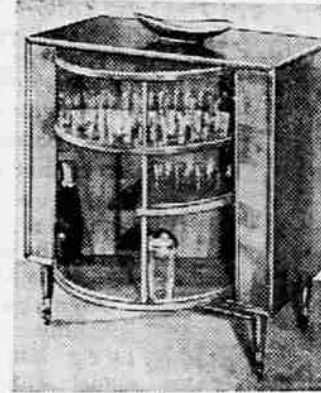
Glenn Blake, labor council president, announced that the school was to be placed on the "unfair list." Blake said the unfair label means parents who belong to unions will be expected to take their children out of the school. He also said the school probably would be picketed.

**Contract Refused**  
The dispute arose from the priest's refusal to sign a contract with the union covering four janitors.  
"When Mr. Blake urges

Central parents to withdraw their children from school in order to force us to accede to union demands, he has hit a new low in boycotts," Father Whalen said.

"Possibly this is the first time in our history that a union representative has sought to alienate a child from his school to achieve his ends."

Blake said that circulars would be passed out in the next few days to the school's 965 students so they can inform parents of the union side of the dispute.
