

Judge Verbally Lashes Confessed Killer of Girls

San Diego, Calif.—(AP)—There are some crimes so revolting that the only proper punishment is the death penalty. As I sat here and heard tape recordings in which the defendant told how he killed these girls, I was shocked. I hope I never have to hear such testimony again.

Superior Judge John A. Hewicker, a veteran of criminal trials, uttered those words Wednesday as he sentenced Harvey M. Glatman to death in the gas chamber.

Glatman, 31, of Los Angeles, heard the death penalty without showing any outward concern.

Remains Calm

The jug-eared television repairman was as calm in the face of death as he was in relating to police officers how he kidnaped and raped three young Los Angeles area models during a one-year period, forced them to pose in the nude while he photographed them and then killed them.

He strangled the attractive women with a rope and dumped their bodies in isolated desert areas.

Only the body of blonde Judy Ann Dull, 19, was accidentally discovered in a shallow grave near Indio north of here. The body was so badly decayed that police were unable to identify her and it was not known she had been murdered until Glatman's arrest Oct. 27.

Only Bleached Bones

He led police to the remains of his two other victims after his arrest. Only bleached bones remained.

The victims, Shirley Ann Bridgeford, 24, mother of two children, and Ruth Rita Mercado, 24, had been listed by police as missing up until Glatman was caught while he attempted to abduct a fourth victim.

When he told police all—and with no apparent remorse. Since his arrest he has insisted that he wants to die in the gas chamber rather than spend life in prison.

He refused to plead innocent by reason of insanity and a court-appointed psychiatrist has ruled he is legally sane, although two defense psychiatrists have indicated they believe him insane.

An automatic review of Glatman's case will be made by the State Supreme Court, after which a date for execution probably will be set.

White Clothing Urged in Fog

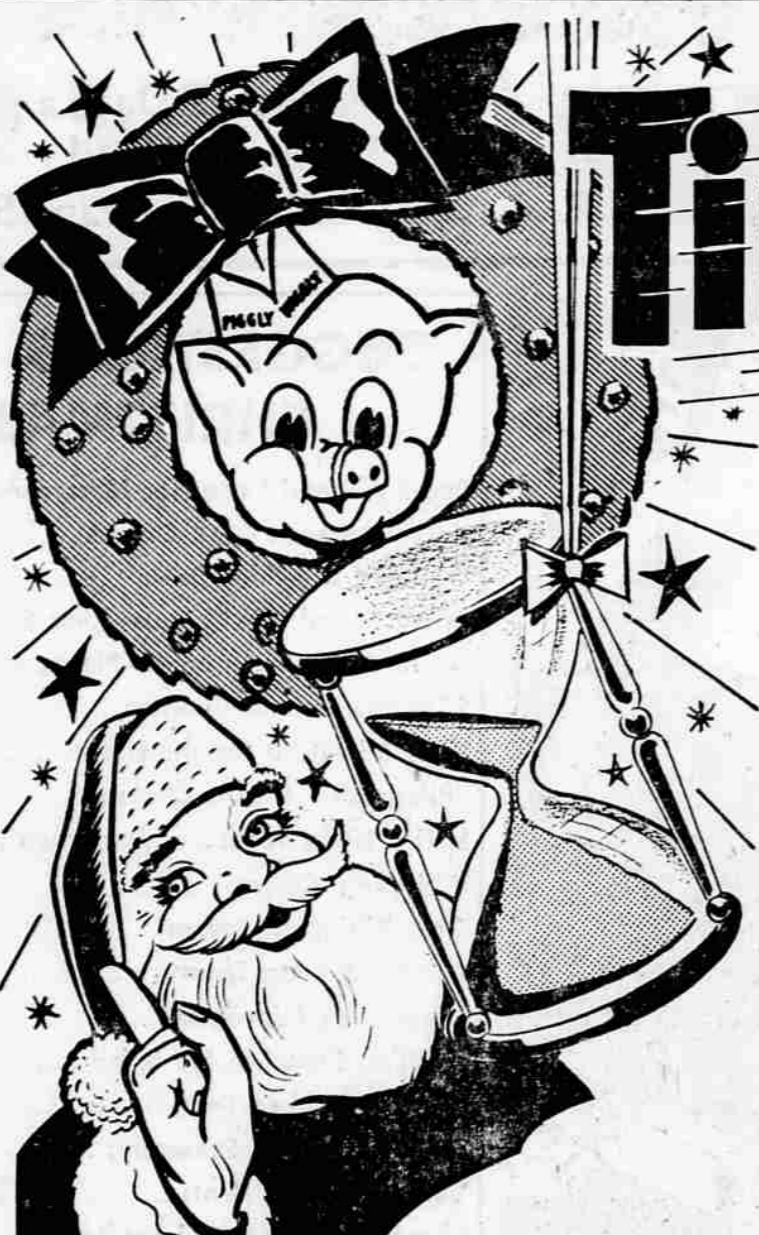
