Worst Brush Fire Now Under Control
 San Juan Capistrano, Calif. - Firefighters Friday night brought under control California's worst brush fire of the year after an intensive six-day battle.

Richard Johnson, U.S. forest Service fire prevention officer, called the blaze, which blackened more than 100 square miles of brush, "one of the granddaddies of all times."

Official control was announced at 8 p.m. Friday night after a crew of 2,700 men halted the advance of several major hot spots along the northern perimeter.

Johnson said, however, that scouting parties would be held in the area until the first substantial rainfall.

Nineteen homes and cabins were destroyed in the blaze which consumed an average of 500 acres of dry undergrowth and timber an hour.

Joe Adams, a ranger from Prescott National Forest, Ariz., was the only fatality reported. He was killed Thursday when he was leading a hotshot crew of Hopi Indians on a scouting mission and a sudden shift of winds enveloped him in flames, the Forest Service reported.

Head-On Collision Kills Lebanon Man
 Corvallis - A head-on collision 11 miles south of here Saturday afternoon claimed the life of John Paul Wirth, 42, of Lebanon, and injured three other persons, one of them critically.

Marlin E. Redfield, 68, Eugene, was listed in critical condition at a Corvallis hospital. Less seriously hurt were Harry W. Weaver, 20, and his wife Loretta May, 21, both of Eugene.

State Policeman Jay Crooks said the Weavers and Redfields apparently were traveling south and Wirth north when the accident occurred. Wirth was en route to Corvallis to get his wife who had been staying with her mother, Crooks said.

Team Manager's Daughter Injured

Judy Ann Gordon 18, of 1809 Lindero rd., Sacramento, Calif., daughter of Joe Gordon, manager of the Cleveland Indians baseball team, was reported injured in a traffic accident a half mile north of the Big Y store Saturday morning, Medford police said.

Medford Ambulance attendants said the girl identified herself as the daughter of the famed second baseman and now baseball manager. She was taken to a local hospital where she was treated for cuts and released.

The injuries resulted in a three-car rear-end collision on the North Pacific highway, police said. The girl was a passenger in a car driven by Jerad Claude Ede, Natana, Calif., Medford city police said. Richard Bihlmaier, 1252 Beach st., Eugene, a German exchange student, also was riding in the Ede car, and was treated for injuries.

A car driven by Cecil Clair Stater, 1242 Bens lane, Medford, had stopped to make a left turn off the highway, police said. The car in which Miss Gordon was riding stopped behind him when it was struck by a car driven by Ford Denver Ralph Ladd, 1121 Pinecroft st., Medford.

The force of the collision drove the Ede car into the first car, city police said. Ladd was also taken to the hospital for treatment.

New County, City Maps Available

The Jackson County Chamber of Commerce last week published 10,000 copies of a new and revised city and county map.

The maps show new city boundaries to include recent annexations and includes a street directory, information about the city and county, and an outline map showing county's location in relation to the other five western states.

The chamber said it felt a new map was needed, not only to bring up to date recent changes for local use, but also to be ready for increased demand for a current map during the Centennial year.

The maps are blue and black on white. Incorporated cities are shown in light blue with rivers and lakes a dark blue.

Chamber officials said the map was published at cost and are available at 15 cents each in lots of 25 or more. They will cost 25 cents per copy individually.

Cousins Sentenced For Burglary Try

La Grande - (UPI) - Two cousins, Alonzo William and Elijah Dean DeClue, were sentenced to two years each in the Oregon state prison Friday by Circuit Judge W. F. Brown after confessing to an attempted burglary last month.

The two cousins, both from La Grande, were arrested Thursday by La Grande city police and admitted attempting to rob the Angel Metropolitan grocery store Nov. 19.

Alonzo, 20, and Elijah, 21, told police they entered the store with a loaded .38 revolver and demanded money. The two were scared off by Metropolitan and his wife after the man told the DeClues he didn't know how much money was in the store and his wife went to a back room to check.

Four Area Youths Get Scholarship

Spokane - (UPI) - Four boys from Northwest states were picked by the Northwest selections committee in Spokane Saturday night to receive two year Rhodes scholarships at Oxford university in England, beginning next fall.

The four picked are Erik S. Ronhovde, a student at Harvard university from Missoula, Montana; Bryce E. Nelson from Boise, Idaho, and also at Harvard; Roger Young from Sacramento, California, a student at Reed college; and Cadet Bradley Hosmer of the Air Force Academy, representing North Dakota.

The committee was headed by Benjamin H. Kizer of Spokane. There are seven other selection committees across the nation, which will each make a selection of four boys to receive the Rhodes scholarship - a total of 32 will receive the honor in this country.

The boys will get an automatic two year scholarship, and possibly three years of study at Oxford.

Elevator Shaft Fall Proves Fatal to Man

Portland - (UPI) - Jim Smith, 65, Portland, died in a hospital here Saturday of injuries suffered Friday night when he fell down an elevator shaft at the Geneva hotel.

Smith was found in the elevator shaft lying unconscious and police were called. The man had apparently opened the elevator doors on the first floor and stepped into the shaft thinking the elevator cage was on the same level.
