Thousands Face Lean Holiday in Wake of Strikes

By United Press International Thousands of Americans faced a lean Christmas today in the wake of strikes. Nearly 100,000 office and factory workers were idled.

Largest of the walkouts were against Eastern and American Airlines and International Harvester.

Eastern Airlines, grounded by a strike of machinists and flight engineers, normally has a payroll of 16,000, but only about 1,600 still were working. The rest were striking or the idle are in Miami, where the idle are in Miami, where 7,000 were employed.

Some 1,500 pilots walked out last Friday midnight against American Airlines, grounding that carrier. The airline said it would maintain 20,000 other employees over the holidays but said all have been notified they will be placed on emergency leave without pay Jan. 4 if the strike continues.

Production Workers Idded The AFL-CIO United Auto Workers strike against International Harvester, which began Nov. 13, has idled 37,000 production workers at Harvester plants in Illinois, Kentucky, Indiana, Tennessee, Ohio and California.

A strike of the Newspaper and Mail Deliverers Union against New York City newspapers has idled an estimated 15,000 newspaper employees. Magazine distributors estimated 10,000 of the city's 16,000 newstands were shut down because of the walkout.

Newstand operators were uncounted among the idle because of their status as independent operators.

The beaver may be the leading engineer among North American mammals, but if so, then the badger should rank as a very close second.

This squat, powerful animal, found throughout the western part of the United States and southern Canada, have been observed to replace old bedding of leaves, moss and grass, and there are several cases on record of badgers having constructed latrine pits near the entrances of their homes.

Almost Sinks The rapidity with which he works is extraordinary. Though he is a sizeable animal — a weight of 25 pounds being not at all uncommon — he can dig so fast that he almost sinks into the ground. That is an advantage that comes in handy for hunting as well as building. Ground squirrels and other rodents are an important item on his menu, and one of the ways he catches them is to sink a shaft to where they are. How he determines the location of his prey in that case is a mystery. He does it, though, and possibly the reason why it is still there when he arrives is because the creature is paralyzed by fear.

And well it might be. The badger's power of tooth and claw is such that bigger animals have a healthy respect for him. Though the biggest badger stands probably no more than nine inches high at the shoulder, it is impossible for another creature, such as a coyote or even a bear, to get a grip on him. He can almost turn around in his skin, and his skin is so tough that for many years it was preferred over any other kind

Russia Adopts Record Budget

Moscow - (UPI) - The supreme Soviet (parliament) has adopted an all-time high budget for 1959 that included an 8 per cent boost in national income and a huge science appropriation to keep abreast of the space age.

The science outlay was double the figure approved for the 1958 budget. The bill also included increased spending for school reforms and a sharp reduction in government administration expenditures.

The final budget was set at 723,369,159,000 rubles (\$180,842,289,750) at the official rate of exchange with expenditures of 707,637,887,000 rubles (\$176,909,471,750).

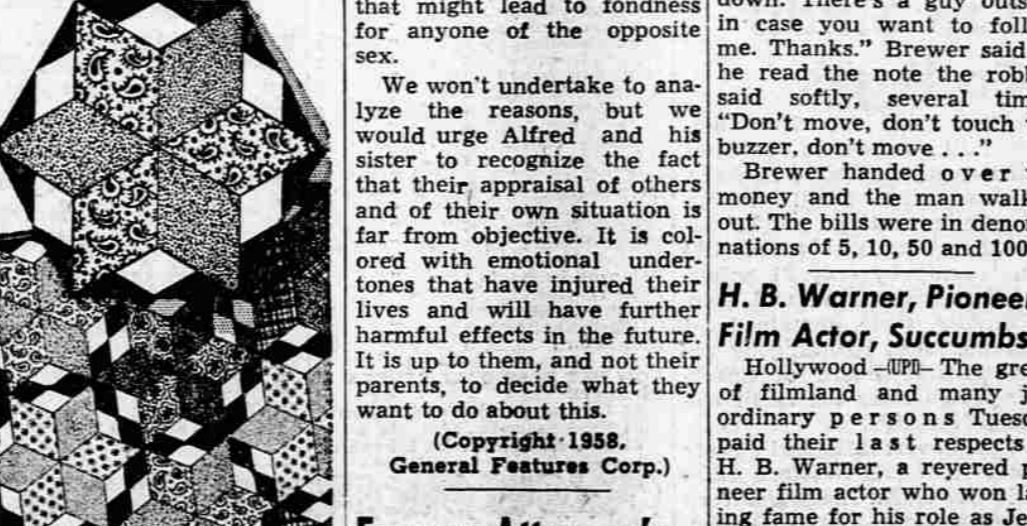
