New York—The industrial average continued its climb toward the 600 level in a moderately active session today.

The average set a new all-time high at 581.36 at 2 p.m. where it was up 4.05 points. Railroads joined the rise at a slower rate and the utility average set a new 28-year top. The average for 65 stocks—20 railroads 156.98, up 0.12; 15 utilities 90.50, up 0.24, and 65 stocks 201.66 up 1.07. Sales today were about 3,900,000 shares compared with 3,790,000 shares Monday.
