

Two Killed in Dynamite Blast

San Carlos, Ariz. —(UPI)—Two persons were killed and eight others injured on the San Carlos Indian Reservation early Thursday when celebrants brought in the new year by tossing lighted sticks of dynamite.

Mike Windham, criminal investigator on the reservation, said about 10 Indians were engaged in tossing the dynamite out of a doorway like firecrackers when one of the participants apparently dropped a lighted stick into a box of dynamite, touching off

an ear-splitting blast that left "nothing but toothpicks."

Dead were Deb Hinton, 27, and his 17-year-old sister, Nona.

SPASTIC PARALYSIS

I have learned most of the medicine I know by listening to people who have been, and are, and will be, and occasionally I learn much by reading a book by someone who has been through hell with some illness. There recently came to my desk one of these books, a sprightly one called "Three Steps Forward," written by Vera Dean (Faber and Faber, London). It tells about a girl who was born with a bad case of spastic paralysis or cerebral palsy. Many people who are fighting their way back to health, in spite of this disease, could doubtless find much comfort in reading this book, just as Vera Dean found great comfort in reading Christy Brown's classic, "My Left Foot." (Simon and Schuster, New York.

That is a wonderfully well-written book by an Irish boy who was born badly palsied, and later was tremendously helped by fine doctors. Another wonderful book by a palsied man (it may be found in many public libraries) is Dr. Carlson's, "Born That Way." I have had the privilege and pleasure of knowing Dr. Carlson, and of having him in my home for a visit. In spite of terribly physical handicaps, and a complete lack of mon-

Agreement Reached On Labor Contract

Portland—(UPI)—Agreements covering more than 6,000 construction workers in Oregon and southwest Washington have been reached in negotiations between employer groups and various unions, it was announced Wednesday.

The new agreement took effect yesterday.

Some 5,000 building laborers in Oregon are affected by a contract that provides a 50-cent hourly package boost over a three-year period.

A second pact gives about 1,000 hod carriers a package pay raise of 55 cents an hour in a three-year period.


A third agreement gives cement masons in Oregon and southwest Washington approximately 50 cents more an hour over a like period.

Negotiations were still under way in an effort to reach agreement between the Carpenters and Iron Workers union and employers.

Two Injured in Highway Accident

Two persons were injured yesterday morning in a one-vehicle accident on Highway 99 approximately one mile south of the Talent junction, according to Oregon state police.

Taken to Ashland General hospital by Litwiller's ambulance were Jesse Tot Willis, 116 Edyth st., Dunsuir, Calif., and his wife, Barbara. The couple's three children, Thomas Edwin, 2; Dolly Jo, 1; and Phyllis Althea, 6 months, who were in the automobile at the time of the accident, were not injured police said.

Willis was reported to have suffered hip and facial injuries while Mrs. Willis was reported to have a possible fractured cheek bone. Both were admitted to the hospital this morning, according to hospital officials.

The automobile was traveling north on Highway 99 when the driver apparently went to sleep, police said. The car crossed the highway and hit an embankment on the west side of the road. Guests Evacuated From Portland Hotel

Portland—(UPI)—Guests on three floors of the Multnomah hotel were evacuated temporarily New Year's eve after three objects identified as incendiary bombs were found in a sixth floor room.

Police said the bombs, apparently home made, were found in a check of the room of a man who had been taken to Good Samaritan hospital after becoming ill.

Assistant Hotel Manager Hal E. Carey said the check showed three gift-type liquor boxes containing metallic objects with wires protruding from their ends. Police called Sgt. James R. Bagwell of the 53rd ordinance detachment at Vancouver barracks. Bagwell found the objects to be lengths of three-inch galvanized pipe, capped and containing an explosive material, police said.

Police said the man was identified as Walter Seward Hight, 54, Beaverton. He was booked on charges of maintaining a fire hazard and of possessin explosives, police said.

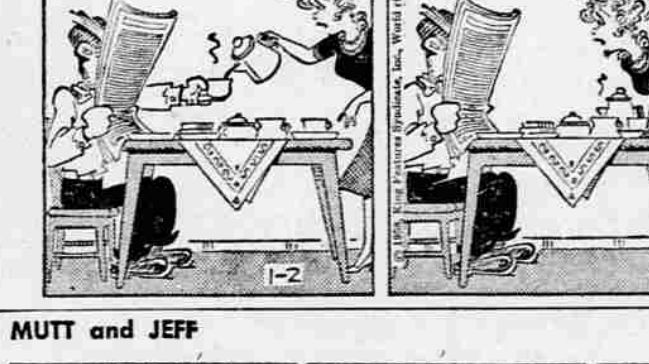
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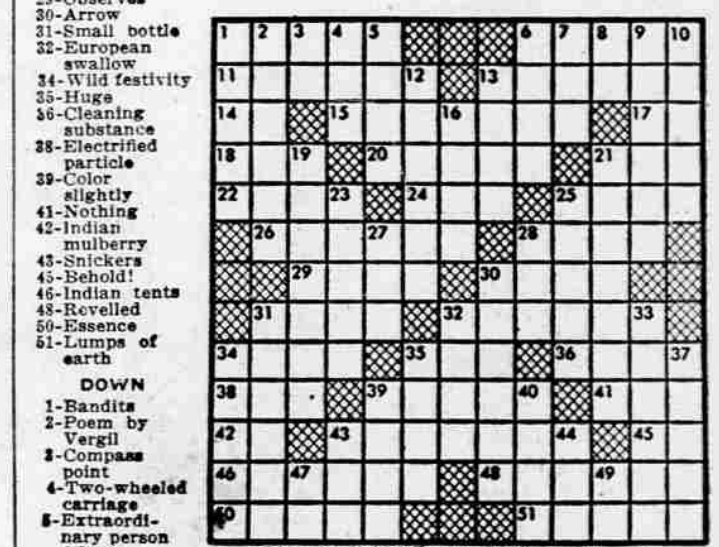


CROSSWORD PUZZLE
