57 Million Americans Start Paying Increased Social Security Taxes

Washington—UPI—Some 57 million American job holders Thursday started paying from 11 to 26 per cent more in social security taxes.

Another 12,500,000 Americans will get a 7 per cent increase in their monthly pension checks.

Both changes in the social security law were made by the last Congress.

The tax boost will cost a \$60 a week worker 15 cents a week more than he paid last year. Those earning \$4,800 or more a year will pay the maximum increase: \$25.50 a year for employees and \$38.25 a year for self-employed.

However, the tax increase may seem a lot bigger to many workers. Starting yesterday the payroll deductions for workers earning \$100, \$150 and \$200 a week will be

hiked to \$2.50, \$3.75 and \$5 a week, respectively.

This sharp increase stems from the fact that such persons will complete their 1959 payments before the end of the year. Deductions then will cease until Jan. 1, 1960.

The Social Security administration figures that during the coming year about 74 million persons will work at part and fulltime jobs covered by social security, and therefore will be hit by the tax increase.

The tax boost on employees will be matched, as usual, by their four million employers. The tax increase on self-em-

ployed persons covered by the social security program will continue to be 50 per cent higher than the rate paid by wage and salary earners.

Higher Payments

The 12,300,000 persons already on the social security rolls will receive their beefed-up January pension checks the first week in February. They don't have to make a special application. The 7 per cent increase is automatic.

However, wives of disabled pensioners must apply to obtain special new benefits voted for them.

As a result of the new changes, nearly half a million people who have not been covered before will become eligible for benefits as well as taxes. They include certain state and local government employees and some seasonal workers as well as others.

Girls Say Robbery Attempt Just 'Joke'

Salem—UPI—Police Thursday said they had arrested two teen-age girls who admitted they tried to hold up a Salem housewife and a grocer early Tuesday.

The girls, aged 15 and 17, were turned over to juvenile court. They said their holdup attempts were a "joke."

The girls, who covered their faces with bandanas and used toy pistols, insisted, "We didn't intend to get any money—just have some fun."

Senate To Seat One of Largest 'Freshman Classes' in History

Washington—UPI—The Senate will seat what may be the largest "freshman class" in its history when the 86th Congress convenes Jan. 7, 1959.

Voters in 33 states, including newly-admitted Alaska, sent 15 new Democrats and three new Republicans to the Senate in the fall elections.

Senate record-keepers believe the 18 new members comprise the largest freshman class since the first Congress and are sure it hasn't been topped in this century.

While none of the new men has had previous experience in the Senate, 11 have served in the House of Representatives. All but one of the remaining seven have held some state or local appointive or elective office.

The Far West and East sent the largest group of new senators. Counting the two Alaskans, six of the freshmen come from Pacific and Mountain states. States along the northern and central Atlantic seaboard sent six new men and the Midwest elected four. No freshmen were elected by states in the Deep South, but West Virginia, a border state, sent a pair of newcomers.

Quick Look

Here is a quick look at the new Senators:

Ernest Gruening (D-Alaska), 71, was Territorial Governor for 13 years before 1953. He held a number of appointive offices before President Franklin Roosevelt named him governor. He was an active advocate of statehood.

E. L. (Bob) Bartlett (D-Alaska), 54, was Alaska's elected, non-voting Delegate to the House of Representatives from 1944 until the approval of statehood in 1958. Clair Engle (D-Calif.) is a peppy 46-year-old California attorney who served 14 years in the House and gave up chairmanship of the key (for the West) House Interior Committee to seek the post vacated by Sen. William F. Knowland (R-Calif.).

Former FBI Agent

Thomas J. Dodd (D-Conn.) is a white-haired, 51-year-old former FBI agent and Justice Department official who served two House terms ending in 1956 when he lost a bid for the Senate. He defeated Sen. William A. Purtell (R-Conn.) this time.

R. Vance Hartke (D-Ind.), 39, a political unknown outside of Indiana was mayor of Evansville and ended years of Republican control in his state when he beat GOP Gov. Harold Handley for the seat vacated by Sen. William E. Jenner (R-Ind.).

Edmund S. Muskie (D-Maine) became Maine's first Democratic governor within living memory in 1956, but his victory over Republican incumbent Sen. Frederick Payne in September still was a surprise to many and a portent of the national Democratic sweep.

Philip A. Hart (D-Mich.) picked off the seat of Sen. Charles E. Potter (R-Mich.) to capture for the Democrats the last important statewide elective post held by the GOP.

10 Years in House

Eugene J. McCarthy Jr. (D-Minn.) moved up after 10 years of service in the House to defeat Sen. Edward J. Thye (R-Minn.). McCarthy is 42 and a former college professor.

Howard W. Cannon (D-Nev.), 46-year-old Las Vegas city attorney, defeated veteran Sen. George W. Malone (R-Nev.) in another upset. An Air Force reserve colonel, Cannon joins Sen. Harry Goldwater (R-Ariz.) as the Senate's second qualified jet pilot.

Harrison A. William Jr. (D-N.J.) and Hartke are at 39 the youngest members of the new class. But the handsome New Jersey lawyer served a pair of House terms until 1956, when he was beaten.

Kenneth B. Keating (R-N.Y.) reluctantly gave up his position as ranking Republican on the Judiciary Committee after six terms in the House to seek the vacant seat of Sen. Irving H. Ives (R-N.Y.).

The silver-haired, 58-year-old attorney's victory in the Empire State gave Republicans one of their few triumphs in the November elections.

Stephen M. Young (D-Ohio), a 69-year-old attorney, served four House terms during the New and Fair Deal era, surprised even his own party by beating Sen. John W. Bricker (R-O.).

Hugh D. Scott (R-Pa.), once Republican National Committee Chairman, defeated Democratic Gov. George M. Leader for the seat of retiring Sen. Edward Martin (R-Pa.). A veteran of eight House terms, the 58-year-old lawyer had been one of four Republicans on the key Rules Committee.

Winston L. Prouty (R-Vt.), bucking a Democratic trend, won the post vacated by Sen. Ralph Flanders (R-Vt.). A former legislator and mayor, the 52-year-old Vermonter served four terms as his state's only House member.

Robert C. Byrd (D-W. Va.), 39, defeated Sen. Chapman Revercomb for a full six-year term. He had served three terms in the House after two terms in the state legislature.

Jennings Randolph (D-W. Va.) is another veteran of the House during the Roosevelt and Truman administrations. The 56-year-old former newsman knocked off Sen. John D. Hobbitt (R-W. Va.) for the two years remaining to the term of the late Sen. Matthew Neely (D-W. Va.).

Gale McGee (D-Wyo.), is a 43-year-old college professor whose first shot at politics turned Sen. Frank Barrett (R-Wyo.) out of office. McGee knows Washington as a former aide to Sen. Joseph C. O'Mahoney (D-Wyo.), who

will be his senior colleague. Frank E. Moss (D-Utah), 47, a one-time Securities and Exchange commission lawyer, defeated both Sen. Arthur V. Watkins (R-Utah) and former GOP Gov. J. Bracken Lee, who ran as an independent.
