

\$4 Billion Paid to Unemployed Men

Washington - (UPI) - An estimated four billion dollars in jobless benefits were paid to eight million unemployed workers in recession-scattered 1958.

Secretary of Labor James P. Mitchell, in making these figures public today, said the amount of benefits was almost double any other year.

The average benefit per week was a record \$30.57, exceeding the 1957 average by more than \$2 weekly. Payments replaced only a little more than one-third of wages lost because of layoffs, Mitchell said.

About 2,600,000 workers exhausted their rights to benefits, Mitchell reported. Temporary extension of benefit periods in 22 states allowed 1,500,000 of them to receive an additional 400 million dollars in benefits once the program went into effect in June.

The Medical Roundup

A NEW LUNG INFECTION

Every so often I meet someone who is greatly annoyed because we doctors keep finding new diseases. As he says, "Haven't you got enough already, with influenza, hunting for a morpheus? But I am sure we doctors don't want new diseases any more than lay persons do."

Of late, as Dr. Michael L. Furcolow, of the Government's Communicable Disease Center at the University of Kansas Medical School, has been pointing out, it looks as if more than 30,000,000 Americans, at some time of their life, get histoplasmosis. This used to be looked on as a rare disease until about 1945. Now, it has been found in 22 states that center on the Missouri, the Mississippi, and the Ohio River valleys. The cause is a fungus that grows best in damp shady areas, and in soil of a certain type. Because the parasite can live in birds, favorite spots for infestation are chicken coops, pigeon roosts, caves where birds sleep, storm cellars, and silos.

Dr. Samuel D. Clark, of the medical department of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cambridge, Mass., is now trying to get into communication with all persons who, before 1935, received injections of radium or drank solutions of radium emanation. Dr. Clark wants to see these people so as to get more information as to the long-term effects of radiation. This will help scientists, too, in judging the dangers of atomic bomb "fall-out." All persons who, years ago, had treatment with radium can perform a public service by promptly getting in touch with Dr. Clark.

Snowy Highway Blamed for Mishap

One of the first accidents due to snowy weather occurred last night on the South Pacific highway, 5 miles from the Siskiyou summit, state police reported today.

No injuries were reported and all vehicles involved left under their own power, state police added.

John Clayton Adams, 26, of Portland, had stopped to help a woman motorist stalled on the road. Although the large Friedlander truck driven by Adams was equipped with chains, it was unable to start again.

A car driven by Emmett Paul Jones, 24, of Olympia, Wash. tried to stop to avoid hitting the truck on the road and swung sideways blocking the northbound lane. A second car, operated by Lucille Mead, 49, of Brookings, also attempted to stop and slid into the truck and car.

20,000 Non-Pilot Employees Laid Off

Washington - (UPI) - American Airlines cut about 20,000 non-pilot employees from its payroll today when company and union officials failed to agree on a contract to end a 16-day strike.

Federal Mediator Leverett Edwards, meeting with both parties, told United Press International he couldn't tell about the possibility of a settlement being near.

C. R. Smith, president of American, said the non-pilot employees who have been kept on the payroll during the strike were dropped because "no sound prediction can be made" as to when the strike will end.

American is the only major U. S. airline still grounded by a wave of labor trouble that hit air carriers during the past several months.
