San Sebastian, Spain—Two Spanish fishing vessels reported by radio today they have taken in tow an unidentified submarine drifting on the high seas. The fishing boats, Virgen del Coro and Virgen del Carmen said in a radio message picked up by the Mount Igualdo maritime radio here that the submarine appeared to have no crew aboard. The radio message said the submarine was about 600 tons displacement and carried the marking "X15".
