The Medical Roundup

HOSTESS NEEDED

A hostess is much needed in a children's hospital where the parents of the little patients often get very anxious, wondering what is happening to their child, or how he has come out of an operation or an examination. So often the doctor concerned feels that he just hasn't the time to stop and talk to the parents. He sees no need for telling them why certain things are planned, or being done, or he sees no need for giving them hope, or explaining in simple English what was found and what is wrong. Perhaps he thinks he hasn't the time; but he should find the time and take the time. I never have had any difficulty in finding time in which to answer the questions of patients. Often the taking of one minute to explain something makes the difference between having on one's hands an angry family or a very grateful one. We doctors have never been noted for having any sense when it comes to maintaining good public relations in our offices and hospitals. A few of us doctors get the "God Complex," which is very sad. At college the young doctor is seldom taught anything about handling patients tactfully and in a friendly way: all he is taught is to give them medicine or an operation.
