Quick Cranberry Orange Shortcake

The citrus and the cranberry combine with packaged biscuit mix to make a flavorful, nourishing shortcake. Top it with whipped cream or sour cream for 6 generous servings.

- 2 cups California orange chunks
- 1 1-cup can whole cranberry sauce
- 2 cups packaged biscuit mix
- Butter
- Whipped cream or sour cream

Mix orange chunks and whole cranberry sauce; let stand at room temperature an hour or so. Follow directions on the package of biscuit mix for making biscuits using 2 cups of the mix. Split hot biscuits, spread cut sides generously with butter. Spoon orange - cranberry mixture between and on top. Garnish as suggested above.

Peas, French Style
A super abundance of canned peas reminds us how very good they are when fixed in the popular French style. Five generous servings.

- 1 No. 2 can peas
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1/4 cup chopped onion
- 2 cups finely shredded lettuce
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- Drain peas, reserving liquor

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for soup, gravy or vegetable juice cocktails. Melt butter or margarine in a frying pan; add onion and saute until soft and golden brown. Add peas, cover and heat slowly over low heat until peas are hot, about 5 minutes. Remove from heat. Add lettuce and salt and toss lightly. Serve immediately.

Carrots and Peas

Scrape and slice 2 bunches of young small carrots into 1/2 inch rounds. Cook in 1/2 cup vegetable stock for 10 minutes over a very low flame. Drain, if necessary. Heat 2 tablespoons butter; add the carrots and 1 No. 2 can peas and saute for 5 minutes. Add 1 tablespoon sugar; salt, paprika and marjoram to taste and continue cooking 5 minutes. Stir constantly to prevent sugar from scorching. Garnish with parsley.

Favored Combo

"Sierra Salad" has a very happy and general appeal because it combines the semi-tropical, velvety textured avocado with tart, refreshing grapefruit in tasty lime flavored gelatin. Recipe makes six to eight servings.

- 1 package lime - flavored gelatin
- 1 cup hot water
- 1/2 cup grapefruit juice
- 1/2 cup cold water
- 1 medium-sized avocado
- 1 cup grapefruit sections
- 1/3 cup sliced celery
- Lettuce
- Mayonnaise
- Pimiento or green pepper

Dissolve gelatin in hot water. Stir in grapefruit juice and cold water. Chill until slightly thickened. Cut avocado in half lengthwise, remove seed and skin then dice fruit. Stir avocado, grapefruit and celery into gelatin. Turn into mold and chill until firm. Unmold on lettuce leaves and garnish with mayonnaise and strips of pimiento and/or green pepper strips.

Tuna Stuffed Potatoes

Here is an economical, nutritious packed main dish for lunch or supper. Figure on 1 can of tuna for each 4 baking size potatoes.

Cut slices from top of 4 hot baked potatoes lengthwise; scoop out insides with a spoon and mash. Beat in 2 tablespoons butter, the oil from 1 can of tuna and 1/2 cup hot light cream or top milk. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Add 1 tablespoon minced onion and flaked tuna to potatoes. Pile tuna-potato mixture lightly into potato shells. Place on cookie sheet or in shallow baking dish and bake in a hot oven (450 degrees) about 10 minutes or until lightly browned.

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Butters for Vegetables. For piquant seasoning for practically any fresh vegetable, try these: To melted butter add prepared mustard, chopped parsley, chopped green onions or chives, lemon juice or vinegar, horseradish, garlic or chili sauce.

Forecast Food Bill

The food industry and the consuming public have had a good year, declared Paul S. Willis, President, Grocery Manufacturers of America, Inc., in his annual statement and forecast to the nation.

The food industry grew steadily in 1958 moving up to \$75 billion from the previous year's \$71 billion with 1959 food expenditures for the nation likely to reach \$79 billion. Mr. Willis emphasized the fact that the cost of food

has gone up far less than the overall "cost-of-living" in recent years. Since August 1952 when food prices reached their previous all-time peak, grocery store prices have advanced less than 2 per cent, whereas the overall "cost-of-living" index has risen 8 per cent. This means that food prices actually have held down the general rise in living costs.

Development of new products will continue to be a major source of growth and prosperity for the food industry. Ingenuity shown by the industry in finding out what consumers want in new products with built-in convenience and other desirable features and then developing the products accounts for many of the 6,000 to 8,000 items on supermarket shelves today. The industry fully expects this number to be closer to 12,000 items by 1965. Further startling revelation made by Mr. Willis was the belief that a good half of those 12,000 items will be products unknown today.

Quick Look at Best Buys

The biggest lamb "crop" in years and the biggest canned pea pack in history put these two popular items at top of best buys list. Remember when budgeting that there's a lot of good meat on the lamb besides legs and chops. Poultry, pork and beef prices remain about the same. Vary the menu with fresh, frozen or canned fish.

Vegetable buys are many: cabbage, cauliflower, celery, cucumbers, lettuce, dry onions, potatoes, winter squash, sweet potatoes, green onions, turnips, rutabagas.

Fruit buys include apples, avocados, bananas, grapes, grapefruit, lemons, small size oranges, winter pears, tangerines.

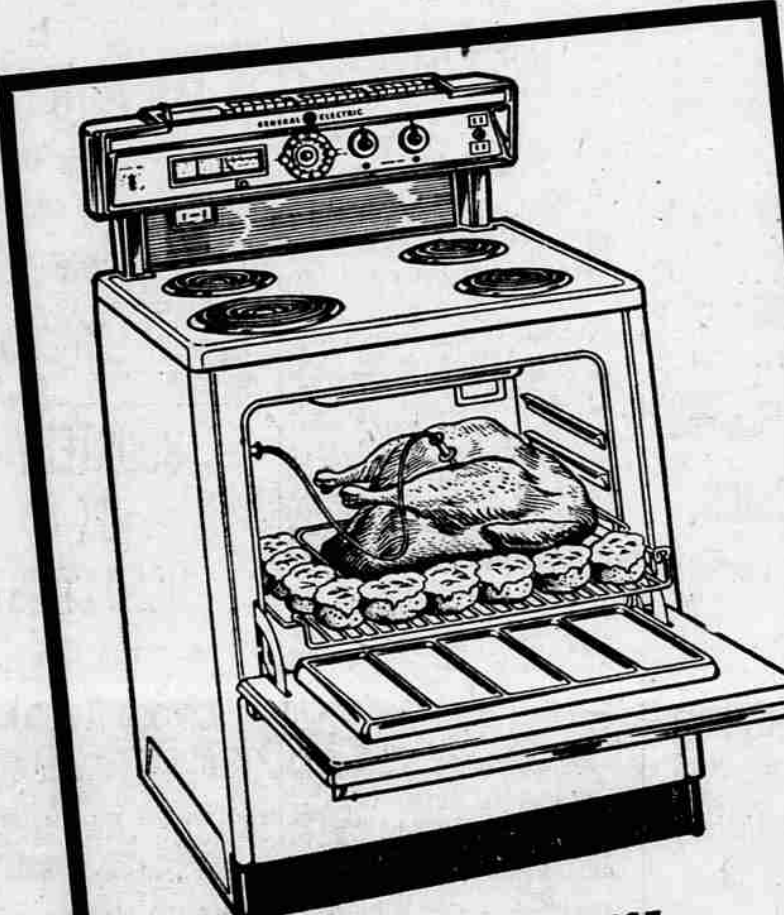

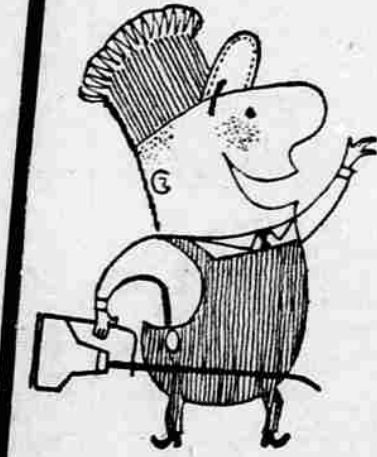
