**DO GLASSES WEAKEN EYES?**

Many people get the wrong idea that wearing needed glasses will weaken their eyes. I can see how they get this idea because, while the person is reading or doing near work, he may see perfectly, but when he tries to read the clock half a block away, he cannot see the hands.

All this means is that the man is "far-sighted," and his ciliary muscle (the muscle that changes the focus of the lens of the eye) cannot relax — after having for years been compelled to contract down hard if he was to see at all, now, when with glasses it no longer needs to contract, it cannot let go.

Good glasses, properly fitted, cannot possibly hurt the eyes; they can only help them. In many cases, it is only natural that when the person takes his glasses off he realizes how much he needs them. This is as it should be. I have been wearing glasses every day and all day for 68 years and they certainly never did me any harm; I still have good vision with them. I cannot do without them because my eyes were poorly made when I was born.

See Better at Distance

Some people say very truly that when they start to wear their new glasses they can see at a distance better without them. But all this means is that their eyes have become so accustomed to straining that, as I said, the ciliary muscle cannot relax immediately. When I was about 35, an able ophthalmologist checked my eyes very carefully — more carefully than anyone had ever done before. Then he said, "You need such powerful glasses that I'm sure if I give them to you, you won't be able to 'accept' them or to use them except for near work."

Having fitted glasses in my medical youth, I knew what the problem was, and so I said, "All right; give them to me and I'll be very patient. I won't accuse you of having given me the wrong glasses." Sure enough, when I got my new lenses, the world was so fuzzy that I came near to walking like a drunk.

Because I could barely walk on the street with them, I asked my optician to make me two "half-way stage" glasses. The strong pair that the doctor prescribed was for reading; an intermediate one was for out-of-doors, and the weakest one was for going to the movies. Why a weak one for the movies? Because in faint light my ciliary muscle always cramped up badly. I think it was all of a year before this muscle learned to be relaxed enough so that I could watch movies comfortably with my "full correction" glasses.

**Trouble Reading**

When I was in my forties I found trouble reading the phone book, and then I had to get bifocals. They immediately were a joy, and they have been a joy ever since. For a while I tried trifocals but since I could not use them
