

Teamster Leader, Lawyer Differ In Testimony

Tacoma — [AP] — A Teamsters Union attorney Friday gave testimony in the Dave Beck income tax evasion trial that was in direct conflict with what Frank Brewster said on the witness stand Wednesday. Samuel B. Bassett, who has been employed by the Teamsters for about 17 years, said he had no hand in preparing an accord and satisfaction agreement by which Beck "repaid" the Teamsters union. Wednesday, Brewster, former president of the Western Conference of Teamsters and current president of Joint Council of Teamsters 28, testified that Bassett had handled all the negotiations in connection with the agreement. Bassett, who had been vague about almost everything else in his testimony, was positive about his agreement. Questioned by Judge George H. Boldt, Bassett said he was "just a messenger boy" in the deal. He said that Seattle attorney George Kashlein had prepared the document and that he, Bassett, had corrected it for minor errors and had turned it over to Brewster. **and now is the time for all**

Two Area Attorneys Named to Service

Salem — For the fourth regular legislative session, the Oregon State bar legal assistance committee has opened offices in the capitol building to make technical legal services available to the lawmakers.

The Bar's public service program extends a helping hand to the busy legislators by providing legal advice, research and similar responsibilities, George L. Hibbard, Oregon City, president of the state organization, explained.

The program does not conflict with the functions of legislative counsel and those of attorney but are supplemental, Hibbard said.

"The impartiality and the need for the legal assistance committee has been well established in the past three legislative sessions," Hibbard said. "The Oregon State Bar is proud of this record of serving the legislators and the people of the state."

Ben T. Lombard, Ashland and Manville H. Heisel, Medford, were among the 20 attorneys in the state chosen to represent the bar in Salem. The committee workers spend two weeks each at the capital. Lombard will serve Feb. 2 to 13, and Heisel will serve from April 13 to April 24.

LUBRICATING RR WHEELS

Philadelphia — [AP] — The Reading railroad says the use of a new "dry" lubricant on the wheels of locomotives will provide "more efficient, more economical, and safer operation of trains." The Reading says it has reduced the wear and tear on its curved rails by 35 per cent through the use of a chemical preparation called molybdenum disulfide applied by a solid lubricating stick attached to the wheel flanges of locomotives. The Reading began testing the wear on curved tracks in 1954. It has made experiments on a 35-mile stretch of track with 150 curves.
