Rio Plane Crash Leaves 36 Dead

Rio De Janeiro, Brazil - (UPI) - Fire, mud and rain combined Sunday to kill 36 persons in the crash of a German Lufthansa Super-Constellation in flames "hot enough to start a chain reaction."

Three crew members survived. All were reported out of danger today. The only American aboard, pilot Capt. Wren McMains of Westover Park, Stamford, Conn., died at the controls after he missed the runway at Galeao International Airport in a blinding rain storm.

The plane touched down in Rio Bay instead, bounced onto Tubiacanga Beach on Governador Island, where the airport is located. It exploded and split apart in flames. Heavy mud delayed the rescue until it was too late.

Firemen who carried portable extinguishers several hundred yards through deep mud to the plane were forced to delay their operations until the flames died down.

They sought refuge from the rain beneath the unburned tail section. One shouted to officials: "No one's alive in there. It's hot enough to start a chain reaction."

Officials said most of the victims were burned beyond recognition. Attempts at identification began in the Rio morgue today.

The plane was on a flight from Hamburg, Germany, to Buenos Aires.

Women Who Bear Their Children Sitting Up. Anyone who has studied the history of obstetrics throughout the ages knows that most primitive women give birth to their babies while squatting, or perhaps hanging onto a rope suspended from the ceiling.

Two Filibuster Proposals Beaten

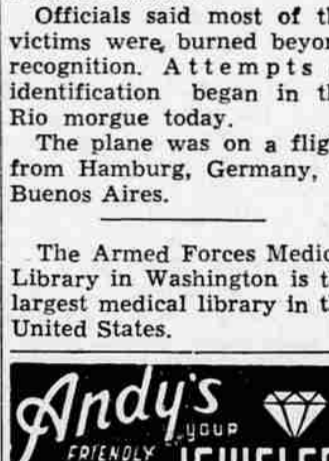
Washington - (UPI) - A powerful bipartisan group Monday defeated two proposals to change the Senate's rules and make it easier to curb filibusters.

The Senate first rejected 67-28 a bipartisan liberal proposal by Sen. Paul H. Douglas (D-Ill.) and others to let a majority of 50 of the 98 senators limit debate. A two-thirds majority of 66 is needed now.

It then defeated a compromise by Sens. Thurston B. Morton (R-Ky.), Clinton P. Anderson (D-N.M.) and John Sherman Cooper (R-Ky.) to permit this to be done by only three-fifths of those present and voting. The vote on this was 58-36.

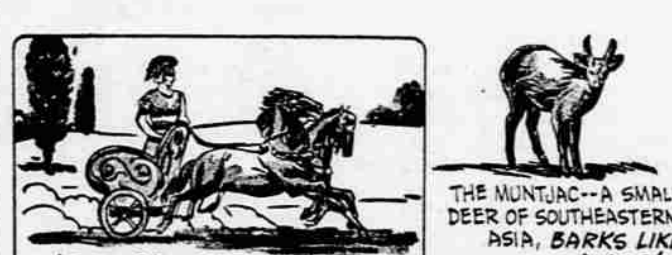

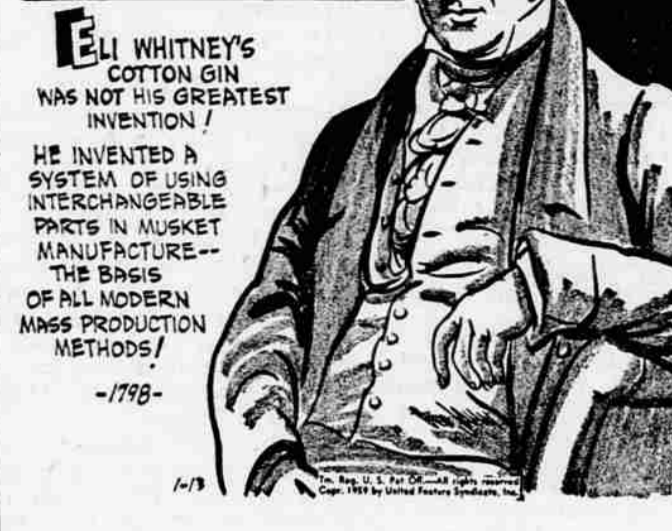

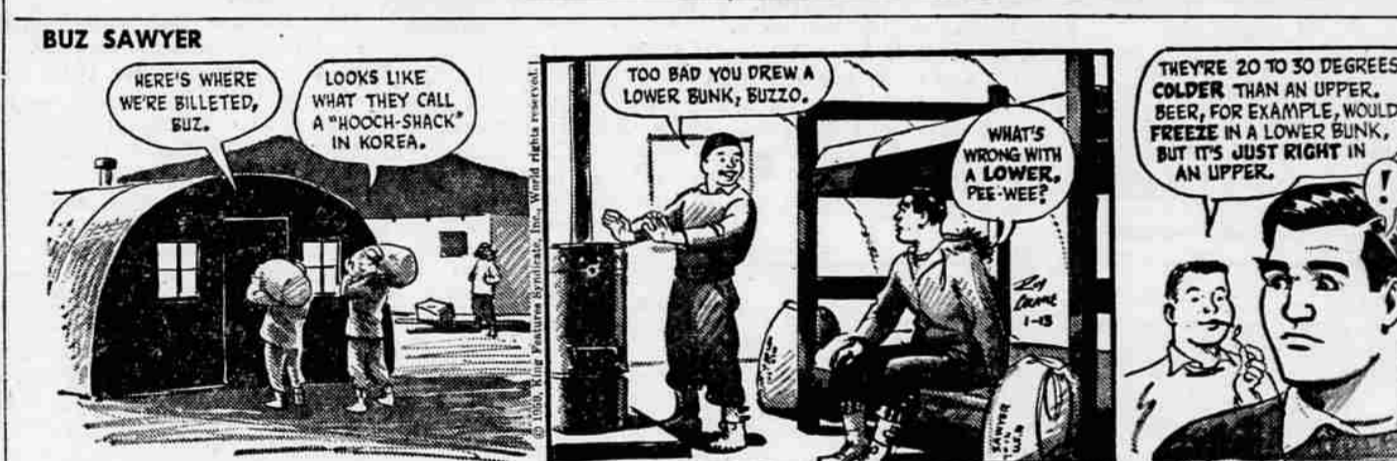
