I would like to move to the city, not only for better job opportunities, but because I feel that I need a change. I have known all of the people here my whole life through and I'd like to meet others. I was always somewhat of a misfit here because I don't enjoy the usual social activities. I love music and other cultural things that are more available in the city.

My parents and older brother and sister are in an uproar at the idea of my leaving home.

Mrs. G. L. - Like most young girls, Cynthia dreams of finding all kinds of glamour in the city. She has visited some of the biggest cities in the country on her vacations and she gets the idea that life there is one constant round of excitement. I have been trying to make her understand this isn't so. People have told me small-town girls are just wasting away with loneliness in cities. They are so desperate they go out on dates with anyone who asks them and men take advantage of the situation.

We realize that Cynthia is finding it a problem to get settled with a suitable young man. Nearly all of her friends are married and she feels isolated. There is a lot of social activity going on and she can find happiness here.
