

'Flaming Crash' of Plane Explained

Modesto, Calif. — Lawmen in Stanislaus county came up with a quick explanation Tuesday when they got a report of a low flying plane, which disappeared with a loud explosion while firing distress flares.

The report came about dusk from an area where the San Joaquin river separates Stanislaus and San Joaquin counties.

"At about that time every day a farmer down by the river fires a homemade cannon to scare off the cranes which settle in his fields," a deputy explained. "It shoots red flares into the air and makes a helluva bang."

"We figure someone saw a low flying plane, then spotted the flares which were followed by a loud explosion," he said. "It was just one of those things."

Lipomas (Fatty Tumors)

Many people are needlessly worried because they have scattered around in many places under their skin, little disc-like tumors made of fat. They are called lipomas. Most of them are about as big as an after-dinner mint. Only rarely have I ever seen one so large that it became a nuisance, and it became advisable to remove it surgically. Because of the present-day campaign to get people to have all tumors removed, some persons get jittery about these lipomas. But they shouldn't be, and they should be reassured when their doctor tells them to leave the things alone. I never heard of one of them that ever turned into anything serious. Several people have written to say that they asked their doctor to cut out their lipomas, but he didn't care to do it. I think he's right. If I had a lot of lipomas I wouldn't bother to have them removed.

For much of my life I have mused over the fact that so many people like those with lipomas — who don't need to worry — worry themselves sick, while hundreds of persons with a cancer on the side of their nose, or on their lip or tongue or face do not realize their danger and are not a bit concerned until it

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Strange As It Seems

Recently, half-dozen women have asked me if there is any help for a mental depression. Most certainly there is. I, like most psychiatrists, have no faith in treating depressions with psychotherapy. One cannot talk a woman out of a psychotic depression. It is no use telling her the advantages of cheering up, because she is going through hell with the suffering, and there is nothing that would please her more than to be able to "snap out of it." In most of these cases, the best treatment is with electroshocks. Usually, a few of these, especially if taken early in the course of the illness, will quickly bring the person out.

I have no fear of these shocks for my patients. They don't cause any pain, because the instant the electricity is turned on, the person is unconscious. Today the current is left on for only a part of a second and there isn't enough of a convulsion to talk about. Usually there are no bad results, and certainly no permanent bad results. About the only thing that the patient may note is that, for a while, her memory is a bit weakened — but that comes back.

I am always happy when I can find a psychiatrist who saves the patient much money by giving the electroshocks either in his office or in an out-patient room in a hospital. In an hour or so a relative will see the person safely home.

A Sore In The Mouth
An old man writes to say that he has developed a sore and ulcerated nodule in his mouth. He says his doctor has been painting it with tincture of iodine. I am sure I would not dare temporize with such a thing; I would so afraid it was cancerous and should be removed right off. There is no sense in waiting until the lymph nodes in the man's neck are greatly enlarged and full of cancer. Then, little can be done for him. Now, perhaps with the exciting knife, or powerful x-rays or radium, the man's life can be saved.
