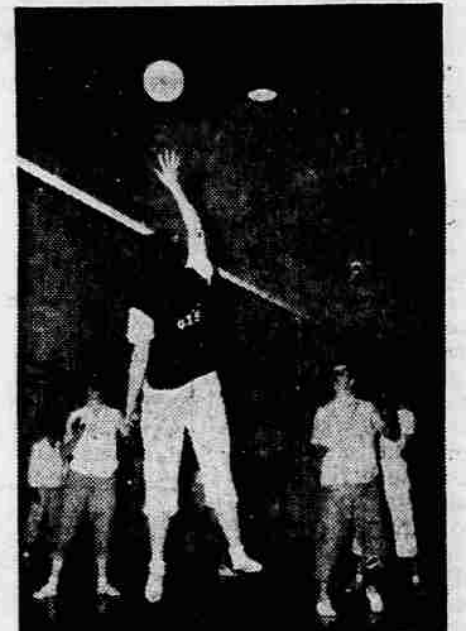
The Medford Y.M.C.A. is a membership organization, with those who belong acting as stockholders in the operation, an operation which is based entirely upon the wishes of the majority of members.

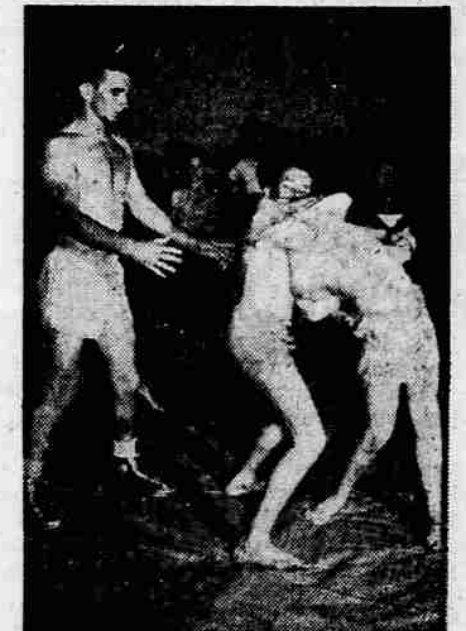
