Front-running St. Mary's of Medford and second place Butte Falls high fortified their positions in the Jackson County B Basketball league last night.

St. Mary's bounced Talent 58 to 34 and Butte Falls survived 44 to 40 after a tough scrap with Jacksonville.

The Crusaders of Medford had good ballhawking and defense in the first half but didn't get into scoring stride until the third period when they racked up 23 points to attain a 42 to 21 gap over the Bulldogs. The Medford club led 13 to 8 at the quarter and 19 to 15 at the half.

Dick Evans was the high

scorer for SM with 13 while Kip Walls' nine was tops for Talent. Ron Daley of the Crusaders was credited with a good defensive job in keeping Bulldog threat Rollie Welburn scoreless.

**Game Close**

Butte Falls overcame an early Jacksonville lead of 6 to 4 and headed by three or four points most of the rest of the way. Quarter scores favored Butte Falls 15 to 12, 21 to 18 and 35 to 32. Scoring of Raymond Abbott with 18 and Larry Cavin with 15 and the backboarding of Abbott made the difference. Ron Davis had 12 points and Ken Perrerrard 11 for the Redskins.

Butte Falls put in 13 of 17 free heave tries and Jacksonville 14 of 21.

St. Mary's took its junior varsity scrape 42 to 36 with Fred Burich and Mike Austin scoring 12 apiece. Dickinson recorded the same number for Talent.

The Crusaders play the Loggers of Butte Falls at Butte Falls on Friday while Prospect will vie at Talent.

## Polaris Missile Failed in Range

Washington — (UP) — Reports circulated today that a Polaris missile flew only about 60 miles toward its 800-mile goal Monday in a test that the Navy billed as "fully successful."

The much-publicized ballistic missile, being developed for launching from submarines, hit the ocean off Cape Canaveral, Fla., about 740 miles short of its target, the reports said.

Under questioning, the Navy now concedes that the test missile "did not reach its intended range." It has downgraded its description of the test to "partially successful."

Until newsmen raised questions, however, there was no visible attempt here to explain that the flight was something less than the sensation at first claimed by the Navy at Cape Canaveral.

The episode seemed to illustrate what may be a growing tendency to let favorable impressions stand unless questioned.

Ashland — Basketball spirits in the Southern Oregon college hoop camp took a big turn for the worse this week when it was revealed that forward Punk Biddington would be lost for the Oregon Tech game tonight at Klamath Falls.

"The fullest extent of Biddington's injuries was not yet known but, in addition to the Oregon Tech fracas, he undoubtedly will be out for the two all-important games against Portland State next week end.

Dick Smith is the likely replacement for the injured Biddington. He has played the spot on numerous occasions this year. On two occasions Smith was a starter at forward.

Looking further, the Raiders appear in good physical shape but need more depth in the forward positions.

Arcadia, Calif. — (UP) — Silky Sullivan after one start this winter, has been shelved for the season because of leg trouble, trainer Reggie Cornell disclosed today at Santa Anita.

The stretch-running sensation of the 1958 winter and spring season has developed a splint in his right front leg after having a similar ailment on his left front leg treated earlier.

The colt was laid up last summer but made a comeback at Tanforan last month when he won a sprint race and again displayed his well-known ability to come from behind.

In his only start at Santa Anita, Silky displayed none of his former stretch-running ability.

### Judicial Power Transfer Proposed

Salem — (UP) — Transfer of all judicial power now held by county courts to Circuit Courts and judges would result from SB 78 read for the first time in the Senate today.

The bill was prepared by the Legislative Interim Committee on Judicial Administration.

In the same bill Sherman county is transferred from the 11th judicial district to the 12th district and provision made that in the 12th judicial district one judge must be a resident of Polk county and one a resident of Yamhill county.
