

Progress Reported In Chemical Control Of Brush, Weeds

Corvallis - Significant progress in chemical control of brush and weed trees on Willamette valley foothill lands has been reported by the Oregon State college school of forestry.

Brush and weed tree encroachment on forest lands is greatly reducing the amount of wood grown in Northwest forests, surveys show. It is estimated that brush has reduced the productivity of more than one-fourth of the forest land of southwest Oregon.

In the OSC field tests, effective kills were achieved with 2(2,4,5-TP) on big-leaf maple, white oak, and thimbleberry, blackberry and poison oak. Bigleaf maple and white oak are considered weed species although both

running tests on minimum doses to hold control costs as low as possible.

Large bigleaf maple can be controlled with a spring basal application of 2(2,4,5-TP) with an oil carrier, tests showed. The chemical is used as a summer application with white oak. Among the more successful tests for white oak control are those in which the chemical is applied to axe frills - or diagonal cuts into the bark. Undiluted 2,4-D in amine form, applied in the spring to axe frills, also gives good results.

Vine maple is a problem child still, tests show. Foliage reduction may be accomplished with aerial sprays of 2,4,5-T or 2(2,4,5-TP) but there is generally a re-sprouting at the base of the plant. The project is being conducted with the cooperation and aid of the bureau of land management.

Firemen said the shop and its contents were considered a total loss. They reported that the blaze probably originated from electrical wiring.

Comet Believed Falling Satellite

Cambridge, Mass. -UPB- A fiery comet was spotted in the Pacific Wednesday at the time and place predicted for the fall of America's giant Atlas satellite.

The U.S. Naval base at Guam reported to Smithsonian Astrophysical observatory here that a "fiery red comet" was seen in the sky at 6:10 a.m. (p.s.t.) today.

The report of another sighting came from the cruiser Rochester, about half way between Hawaii and Japan.

The sightings coincided with predictions by Smithsonian consultant Dr. George Veis. The observatory would not say positively that the comet seen today was the Atlas, but only that Veis had predicted it would fall in the Pacific today.
