Sponge is Lowest Animal Form. But Has Purpose

The sponge is living animal without a backbone. Neither has it arm, leg, skull or a pelvic structure, yet it has a skeleton—a soft, flexible skeleton which has become a household word and an article of common usage.

In its natural environment the sponge is little more than an unique blob of living tissue. It is the lowest in the scale of the many-celled animals.

There are more kinds of sponges than there ever are candidates running for office in an election year. There are even some species of sponge which grow and live in fresh water. These have no commercial value.

Five Kinds in Oceans
Even in the oceans there are only five kinds of sponges that have any commercial importance. These are sheeps-

wool, yellow, grass, velvet and what is called the glove sponge. All the other hundreds of varieties are considered mere clods of matter on the ocean bottom. A storm, or at times even high waves, tears thousands of tons of these creatures loose and later tosses them up on beaches to die in the sun.

At one time, and not too many years ago, there was an area in the Gulf of Mexico measuring, roughly, 9,000 square miles almost teeming with marketable sponges. This vast acreage has almost vanished due to overfishing and a resultant infection and natural enemies. No animal, fish or bird is known to eat them.

Furnishes Home
The sponge body furnishes a home for a host of other forms of aquatic life, one of which is the strange partnership with a species of crab naturally called the "sponge crab."

This little fellow will live no place else except in the body of a sponge. He cuts a hole in the sponge and backs in, making his permanent home in the living tissue. As he grows he enlarges his cavity. The sponge does not seem to mind. Other crabs of other habits come along and grab the piece of sponge that was cut out by the sponge crab and carry it along over their heads like an umbrella. If something happens to the crab, and it usually does, or he gets tired and drops the tiny piece of sponge, it takes "root" on the ocean floor and grows. Given a chance it will develop into a large sponge. Thus by many and varied means does Nature people the oceans with her many wonders.

Fair Commission Transfer Urged In Senate Bill

Salem—(UPI)—The State Fair Commission would be transferred to the Department of Agriculture in Senate bill 88 introduced by Sen. Dwight Hopkins (D-Imbler).

All powers held by the Fair Commission would be transferred to the Agriculture Department under terms of the bill. All present employees also would be transferred. The bill would be effective Jan. 1, 1960, if approved.

Six bills introduced in the Senate are designed to make legal bonds issued by rural fire districts, port districts, water control districts, special road districts, hospital districts and people's utility districts.

Indian Bill Explained
Several legislators attended a conference on Indian affairs convened by the Oregon Council of Churches.

Leander Quiring, chairman of the Interim Commission on Indian Affairs, presided and Gov. Mark Hatfield made an opening address.

Legislators heard aspects of the Klamath termination program explained by Earl Wilcox, State Board of Health, and William Brandhaw, trust officer of the U. S. National Bank, Klamath Falls.

The Klamath termination is now set for 1961 and the federal government has provided some \$90 million to purchase timber in the Klamath reservation if not enough private bidders can be found.

North Grants Pass Road Bids Opened
Salem—(UPI)—Morrison-Knudson Company, Seattle, Wash., with a bid of \$1,329,840, was apparent low among 14 bidders for the grading of 5.68 miles of relocated Pacific highway from north Grants Pass interchange to the Jackson county line Tuesday.

The bids will be considered and contracts let by the Highway Commission here Thursday.

Other projects with apparent low bidders included: Curry: Stockpiling rock for use on the coast highway. Peter Kiewit Sons, Medford, \$32,571.

Goldwater Chosen Chairman by GOP

Washington—(UPI)—Senate Republicans have unanimously approved the appointment of Sen. Barry Goldwater (R-Ariz.) as their 1960 campaign chairman.

Sen. Styles Bridges (R-N.H.), GOP policy chairman, said the Conference of Republican Senators voted 20-9 against a rule change to permit only senators up for reelection to pick the campaign chief.

Goldwater then was named by Conference Chairman Leverett Saltonstall (R-Mass.) and was approved by the conference.

Some members of the liberal GOP bloc in the Senate had opposed Goldwater as campaign chairman because of his labor views. They felt he might give the party an anti-labor tag.

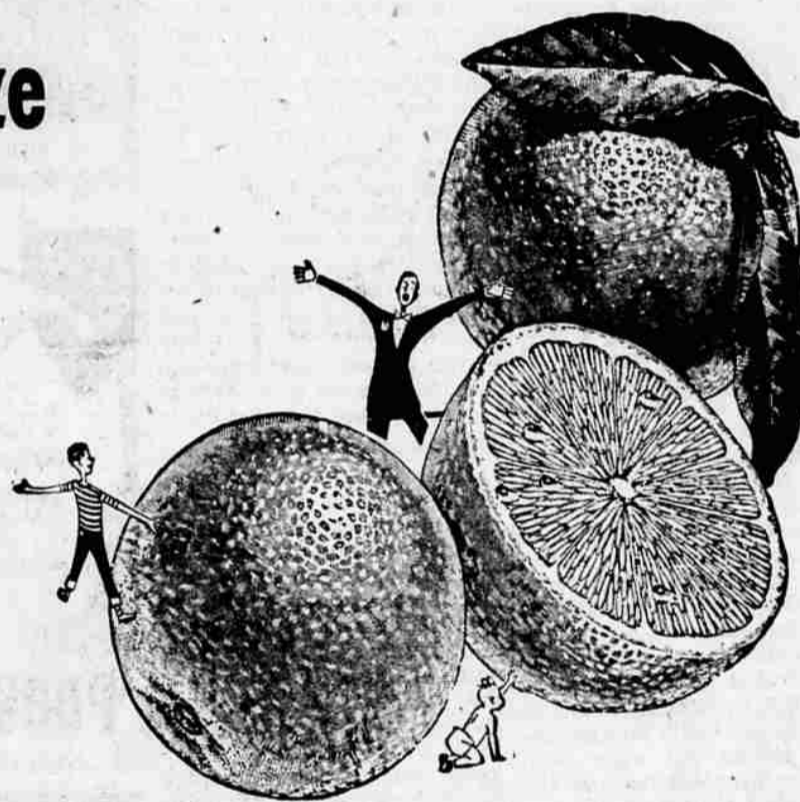
