Two San Francisco Groups to Present Benefits for Fund

Ashland — Two Bay Area theater groups will stage benefit performances on the same night for the Oregon Shakespearean Festival building fund.

Dr. Margery Bailey, co-chairman for fund-raising in the San Francisco region and director of the Festival's Institute of Renaissance Studies, indicated that the Company of the Golden Hind in Berkeley and the Playhouse Repertory company in San Francisco will donate all proceeds from their performances of Sunday, Jan. 25, to help rebuild the Elizabethan stage in Ashland.

"I am intensely proud to be able to say that this wholly voluntary and most unexpected gift seems to me to be characteristic of theater as it exists in San Francisco and the sister cities," Dr. Bailey commented.

Rachmael ben Avram of the Golden Hind and Kermit Sheets of the Playhouse informed Dr. Bailey that their two theaters agreed to aid the Festival's building fund effort by staging the simultaneous benefit performances at 8:30 p.m. Sunday. Both houses are currently presenting long-run hits to capacity audiences composed of theatergoers from Sacramento to San Jose.

The Golden Hind production, staged at the Playbox, 1505 San Pablo ave., Berkeley, is "The Boy Friend."

Gold Hill City Officers Sworn In

Gold Hill—New city officials were sworn in at a recent meeting of the Gold Hill city council. They were sworn in by Ernest Cooper, retiring mayor.

Officers are Milton Steinmetz, mayor; Ferd W. Jones, recorder-treasurer; J. Delos Walker, Fred W. Lester and Kendal Dufur, councilmen. Dufur and Jones were re-elected. Lester was chosen as council president. Committees named by Steinmetz include finance, Dufur, Truman Price and Virgil Gribble; sanitation, Gribble, Lester and Walker; water and lights, Harry Foley, Walker and Lester; nuisance, Lester, Walker and Foley; equipment, Foley, Dufur and Walker; streets and drainage, Gribble, Price and Dufur; fire exposure, Dufur, Foley and Price; and police, Lester and Gribble.

Floyd Taylor was reappointed to serve as city superintendent and chief of police. The council authorized no parking signs at the fire hall, and across the street from the fire hall, and heard complaints of disturbances made by dogs in the city.

Miss Noreen Kelly was reappointed city attorney. Retiring councilmen are Melford Hood and Floyd Lance.
