Alaska Pioneer, Recent Visitor In Valley, Dies

Central Point - Mr. and Mrs. E. R. Yocom of Central Point received word Sunday of the recent death of Alexander Malcom Smith, 99, of Fairbanks, Alaska.

Mr. Smith died following a hip operation in San Jose, Calif. He injured his hip while visiting his son, Malcolm A. Smith, of San Bernardino, Calif.

Mr. Smith was known throughout Alaska and the Arctic as Sandy. He was born in Iverness, Scotland. He came to the Western Hemisphere when he was 18 as an indentured worker for the Hudson Bay company which pioneered Canada's early development.

He later was appointed trail-blazer for the Royal Northwest Mounted police. He guided them into the Rat river district where many people were saved from the scurvy plague. He was second in command of the Sir George Hubert Wilkins expedition to the North Pole in 1926.

Smith was a member of the first grand jury of the District of Alaska at Circle City on the Yukon. He founded the town of Ruby, Alaska, and the A.I. Malcom post office on Wild river in Upper Kuyukuk, northwestern Alaska. Malcom's river is also named for him.

He has collected plant species, gathered information and taken colored slides of wild flowers and other interesting data. He has discovered rich copper, jade and other valuable resources including a single seam of coal which he followed for 150 miles. He is credited with the discovery of the gas and oil field which is today known as Naval Oil Reserve No. 4.

Mr. Smith spent three months last spring in Central Point at the home of the Yocomes.

Mikoyan Receives Welcome at Home

Moscow - (UPI) - First Deputy Premier Anastas I. Mikoyan returned from the United States today to the welcome of a crowd of Russians in holiday mood who greeted him in English and asked his son about Marilyn Monroe.

An official party headed by First Deputy Foreign Minister Vassily Kuznetsov was waiting to greet Mikoyan when he flew in from Copenhagen, where he stopped over for 24 hours on his way home.

A sizeable crowd of Russians was on hand to cheer Mikoyan.

"How do you do?" one joking welcomer called out in English.

"How is Marilyn Monroe?" a girl asked Mikoyan's son, Sergo, 29, who accompanied his father on the American trip.

Alaska To Florida Made in Five Hours

Elgin AFB, Fla. - (UPI) - An Air Force F105 Thunderchief flew 3,850 miles from Alaska to Florida Thursday in just five hours and 27 minutes.

Since Alaska is now a state, it was the longest non-stop flight over the continental United States in the record books. The Air Force said the plane proved its capabilities as an all-weather craft for use by the Tactical Air command.

The nuclear-capable fighter-bomber, flown by Capt. Billy B. White, 30, Caddo Mills, Tex., averaged 700 miles an hour. It was refueled in flight over Edmonton, Alberta, Canada and Omaha, Neb.
