

Film Actor's Widow Gives Birth To Son

Hollywood—(UPI)—The only son of Tyrone Power was born Thursday—two months after the famous actor died. The 5-pound, 12-ounce baby will be named Tyrone William Power, thus carrying on a name made famous on the American stage and screen by his father and grandfather. Mrs. Deborah Power, 27, and the baby were in excellent condition at Cedars of Lebanon Hospital where the birth took place at 10:54 a.m. The pretty former Mississippian coed and Power, 44, married last May 8 at Tunica, Miss. The actor died of a heart attack Nov. 15 while working on a movie in Madrid, Spain. The Po is the longest of all the rivers in Italy and it extends for a total distance of 417 miles.

Cancer Often Arises In A Prepared Soil

Many people probably have the idea that a cancer appears suddenly, out of a clear sky. It can be discovered suddenly, but then a little study will often show that it, or what is called a "pre-cancerous" ulcer or polyp had been growing very slowly for years. In this way the soil was prepared. I remember a man who got a cancer of the stomach. I had known him for years, during which time he had suffered with a chronic type of severe gastritis, or inflammation of the lining of his stomach, due perhaps to his habit of constantly chewing tobacco and swallowing some of the juice. Many a time I have seen a man get a cancer of his lip, which developed after years of irritation of the spot where he held his pipe. Or, perhaps, he got a cancer on the end of his tongue, where for years the spot was irritated by the hot smoke of his pipe. Or he got a cancer in his bronchi (the tubes that carry air into and out of his lungs), apparently because, for many years, he had been a chain-cigarette-smoker and came to autopsy, I was impressed by the fact that the mucous membrane lining his bronchi was a many times thicker than normal, due to a long-lasting irritation. When long ago I was an intern in a big city hospital, I used to see old people with a chronic leg ulcer around their inner ankle. Occasionally, one of these persons who had kept the leg ulcer long enough, got a cancer on the edge of it, again, from years of chronic irritation. I recently read an article by Walter L. Oblinger, Associate Counsel for the Illinois State Medical Society. He was discussing the great tendency of persons today to sue physicians when they are disappointed with the result of treatment. As he says, many people seem to forget that in many a case the physician cannot promise a cure or even a good result from an operation. But now some people are demanding cures, and when these are not forthcoming, an effort is sometimes made to

'Middle-Age Spread' Due To Overeating

Philadelphia—(Science Service)—The "middle age" spread is due to overeating. It is not necessarily the result of growing older, a Connecticut psychiatrist reports. The belief that there is an inevitable increase in weight during the middle years is "another myth which has little or no foundation in fact," Dr. Francis J. Braceland has said. Cause of the middle age spread is the same reason to which spread at other times of life is due—namely, the ingestion of too many calories, or to be blunt, to overeating. 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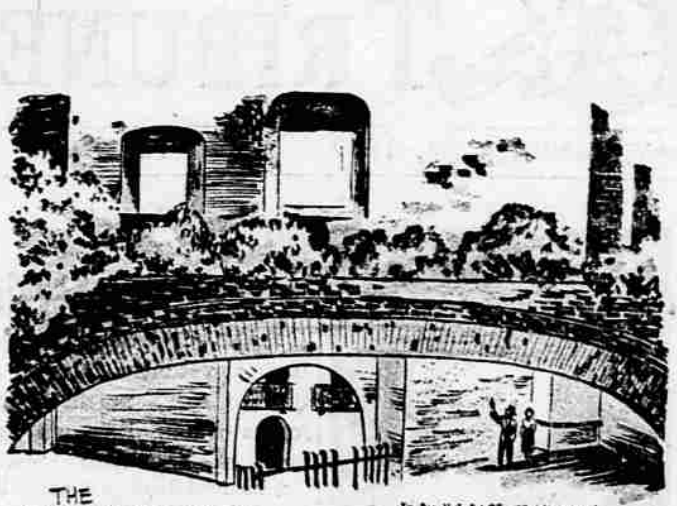

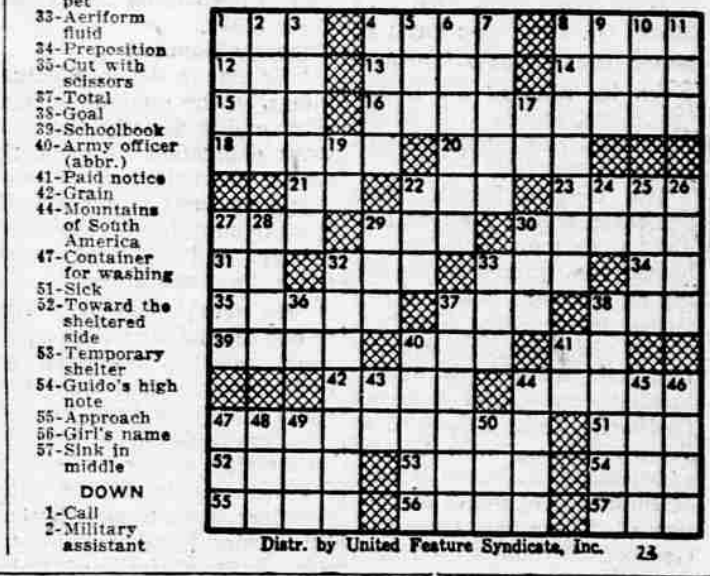
