SOC's Andy Travis won a 2-1 decision from Chico's Dick Gleed to knot the final score.

Charlie Vandergaw and Dave Parkhurst both of SOC picked up two wins for the Raiders by virtue of pins. Vandergaw pinned Paul Senzo with two minutes gone in the third round.

Parkhurst wrestling in the 177 class beat Bruce Bechtal with :31 elapsed in the second round.

SOC won the first encounter between the two arch rivals last Wednesday in Klamath Falls, 71 to 67.

The Raiders will be going into the game short-handed with only one reserve in the front line.

Ashland-Southern Oregon, a pushover the night before, battled Portland State for two overtimes before the home-staying Vikings gained a 75 to 67 victory on the jump shots of Stan Weber Saturday evening.

Portland State now has undisputed possession of the top spot in the Oregon Collegiate conference with the Red Raiders of SOC dropping to second spot with a 5-2 record.

Raider Gordie Carrigan pushed the game into overtime when he sank two field goals in the final two minutes to knot the score at 55-55.

In the first overtime Dick Smith put the Raiders ahead with a field goal and a free throw, but John Winters stormed back with a like total to knot the score again at 58.

Smith added another free throw and Carrigan donated two more but the Vikings kept pumping them in too.

Washington Romps 79-60 Over UO in PCC Scuffle

Seattle—UPI—The Washington Huskies romped over Oregon 79-60 Saturday night to win their fourth Pacific Coast conference game in seven starts.

The Huskies, will all three of their big guns on target, set a blistering pace in the first half, hitting on an even 50 per cent of their field goal attempts while Oregon shot a cool 30 per cent.

Earle Irvine, having one of his best nights, and Doug Smart tied for high point honors with 22 points apiece, and big Bruno Boin had 14.

The high scorers for Oregon were Dale Herron with 16 and Chuck Rask with 13.

At one time during the second half Washington built its lead to 23 points, with the score standing 77-54. Oregon began closing the gap in the final minutes but it was too late for the cold shooting and the out-jumped Huskies.

Washington wound up with a shooting percentage of 47.6 to Oregon's 33.3. Washington outjumped Oregon to pick off 58 rebounds to 45 for the Ducks.

Spahn Braves' Most Valuable

Milwaukee—UPI—Warren Spahn, Milwaukee's indelible left-handed pitcher, went into contract negotiations with club officials today after receiving an award as the Braves' most valuable player of 1958.

Spahn, who will be 38 in April, got the plaque from the Milwaukee baseball writers at their annual Diamond Dinner Sunday night. He got it for his 22-11 record of last year which made him the only southpaw in modern baseball history to win 20 games nine seasons.

The nation's college basketball powers swing back into action this week with Kentucky Coach Adolph Rupp due to notch the 600th victory of his career and unbeaten Auburn and rugged St. John's of New York facing crucial tests.

All of the top 10 rated teams will see action at least once and only a few upsets could cause mighty upheavals in the national rankings.

The week's activity starts tonight with first-ranked Kentucky going for Rupp's 599th win against Georgia Tech, third-ranked Kansas State facing Iowa State, fifth-ranked Cincinnati playing Drake and ninth-ranked Bradley meeting Detroit.

There's the possibility of that big No. 600 for Rupp when Kentucky plays Georgia Thursday night—the night on which rapidly-improving St. John's faces perhaps its biggest test of the season against

Milwaukee Braves Pick McHale General Manager

Milwaukee—UPI—The Milwaukee Braves, searching for a general manager to replace John Quinn—the man who built their championship teams—unexpectedly reached into the American League Sunday night and picked John McHale of the Detroit Tigers.

McHale, vice president and general manager for the Tigers the past three years, will take over the same title and job in succeeding Quinn.

After Quinn resigned suddenly early this month to become general manager of the Philadelphia Phillies, the Braves were expected to hand the biggest part of Quinn's job to their new executive vice president, George (Birdie) Tebbetts, and promote someone in the organization to handle the rest of the general manager's chores.

But Tebbetts said after returning with owner Lou Perini from Chicago, where McHale was signed, that the Braves want McHale "to be another Gabe Paul in the National League." He referred to the general manager of the Cincinnati Redlegs who is noted for his aggressive and shrewd baseball dealings.
