

### APPLEGATE VALLEY Club Discusses Birds

Applegate Valley—A study of native birds was given members of Applegate Valley Garden club Wednesday by the Rev. Thomas McCamant, Medford. The meeting was held at the home of Mrs. Ed Ramsay, and the speaker showed colored slides of most of the birds common to this area.

Many interesting characteristics of bird life were brought out by Mr. McCamant, such as type of song and its variation in seasons, tenaciousness, friendliness, usefulness and destructiveness. Mr. McCamant, pastor of the Medford Congregational church, advised those going to seek birds to go into open areas where birds do not have an opportunity to hide. The speaker said many using books for study do not become acquainted with many of the birds of their own area.

Mr. McCamant gave May 14, 1914, as the date of his first interest in birds, which was the day a school friend received a bird book for his birthday, and the two studied together. The speaker said that through high school and college his interest slackened, but later increased, and that his hobby had developed greatly since living in Oregon. He said Klamath county has the greatest variety of birds in the state, because of water birds.

The next meeting of the garden club will be Feb. 25 at the home of Mrs. Frank Mitchell, when election of officers will be held, seeds and newly developed plants will be discussed. The club is starting a membership drive.
