

Four Basketball Meets Rated As Likely All-Americans

Four fellows sure to draw heavy backing in the All-America poll just two months from now are Johnny Cox, Oscar Robertson, Bob Boozer, and Jerry West—and one glance at Monday night's college basketball results will explain why.

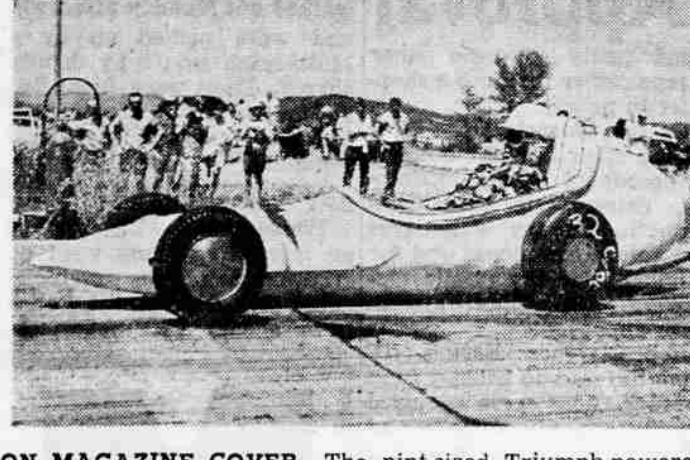
